



How to Throw a UWAA Sports Viewing Party

Getting started:

- Decide if you want to have a party for all televised games, a few, or only one.
- Find a place (pub, bar, restaurant, home) that will agree to carry the game(s).
- Discuss with the venue food/drink specials for your group.
- Contact the UWAA Geographic Program Coordinator with all of the details including time, place, date(s), costs, what people can expect, driving and parking directions, and contact information for the party planner including phone and/or e-mail.
- Call and/or e-mail all of your Husky friends and invite them to the party.
- Go to every game you say you'll host.
- E-mail the UWAA Geographic Program Coordinator every Monday after the party to tell them how many people attended the event.
- Have fun and hand out the Husky prizes the UWAA will send you.
- Collect attendance sheets, complete with names, grad years and email addresses.

Other tips:

- Find another Husky who can attend the party when you can't.
- Try not to pick a place that requires a deposit, a minimum head count, or minimum bar or food purchases. The UWAA cannot cover any expenses. Your viewing party must break even financially.
- Make sure your venue will carry the game in its entirety.
- Keep an eye on GoHuskies.com for game time changes. Make sure you use the time listed for your region and not Pacific/Seattle time.
- Don't worry if you only have a handful of Huskies at your first party. Have them bring their friends to the next one.
- Think about throwing a combined viewing party. They work as long as everyone keeps a competitive but friendly spirit.
