Had a pretty good Thanksgiving Dinner, all things considered.

I want to tell you I don't think I will stay in the Army. There are a great many things I like about, particularly the job I now have. But I think the promotions after the war is over will be extremely slow, so I am considering your offer seriously. However, one thing I have always wanted to do is see Europe. I would be greatly tempted to stay in for one more year, make Capt and go to Germany. But I would have to be guaranteed a European assignment before I would do it. I will have to look

further into this matter and give
it more thought. It would be
great if you and Ma took a
European vacation, and they stayed
in Berning, and we could then see
the country together. Anyway, these
