

Our Extended Degree Program

With our Extended Degree Program, you can continue to work while pursuing your MSW degree. Designed as a three-year, part-time curriculum with evening and weekend courses, our Extended Degree Program gives you the flexibility you need to earn your MSW from the University of Washington, ranked as one of the nation's top social work programs by *U.S. News and World Report*.

Never before has there been a more important time to address the needs of our rapidly changing society. Demand for social workers who are prepared to address the needs of diverse groups is growing. That's why our Extended Degree Program now offers two distinct concentrations, one focused on children, families, and multigenerational practice, and one focused on health and mental health.

Through our MSW Extended Degree Program, not only will you specialize in a field with great demand, among a network of professionals, you also will graduate with a versatile, prestigious degree from a top-ranked university.

Your Professional Foundation

During your first six quarters, you may take courses in the evenings, on weekends (Friday/Saturday), or a combination of both. Evening courses meet once per week; weekend courses meet four full days each quarter. You choose the course schedule that fits your work and family life. The 320-hour foundation practicum is usually scheduled over three quarters. Some courses are enhanced with online content.

Your Advanced Curriculum

You will complete your advanced coursework and practicum in the final five quarters of the program. The 720-hour advanced practicum is usually scheduled over four quarters and may require you to reduce your daytime work hours. The three core advanced courses are only offered on a weekend schedule, while electives are available evenings and weekends.
