


AUGUST HIGHLIGHTS


The National Heart, Lung and Blood Institute, National Institutes of Health, awarded a grant in the amount of \$4,351,874 for a project under the direction of Professor Alfred P. Hallstrom of the Biostatistics Department entitled "Emergency Medical Systems Network Data Coordinating Center." This funding provides support for the first year of a five-year project totaling approximately \$28,500,000. The purpose of the program is to provide a Data Coordinating Center for a Resuscitation Research Consortium to conduct clinical trials in the areas of out-of-hospital cardiopulmonary arrest (OOHCA0 and life threatening traumatic injury (LTI). The practioners will collaborate with community emergency providers, emergency physicians and cardiologists and clinicians at each of five to ten regional clinical centers which will implement the research protocols over the five year period more students to pursue an education in the mathematical sciences.

The Freeman Foundation awarded a grant in the amount of \$576,555 for a project under the direction of Mary H. Bernson, the Associate Director of the East Asia Center in the Jackson School of International Studies, entitled "National Consortium For Teaching About Asia." The East Asia Resource Center is one of five national coordinating sites for the National Consortium For Teaching About Asia (NCTA). The goal of NCTA is to foster a permanent place for Asia in the K-12 curriculum of American schools. The strategy for reaching this goal is to focus on providing professional development programs for teachers. The UW Center serves six Northwest states in offering seminars about East Asia and study tours to East Asia for K-12 teachers in the region.


