
#### SEPTEMBER HIGHLIGHTS


The Environmental Protection Agency awarded a grant in the amount of \$9,115,791 for a project under the direction of Associate Professor Joel Daniel Kaufman of the Department of Environmental Health entitled "Prospective Study Of Atherosclerosis." These funds are for the first year of a ten year thirty million dollar agreement. The investigators in following 6,800 subjects will examine the relation between an individual level assessment of long-term ambient air pollution exposures and progression of sub clinical cardiovascular disease in a multi-city, multi-ethnic cohort. They will also assess the relation between air pollutants and cardiovascular disease using alternate exposure metrics focusing on particle number counts and the chemical composition of particles. The study will provide new and critically important information to understand the relation between air pollution and cardiovascular morbidity and mortality.

The National Institute Of General Medical Sciences, National Institutes Of Health. Awarded a grant in the amount of \$7,056,491 for the 4<sup>th</sup> year of a five-year project under the direction of Professor Wilhelmus G. Hol of the Biochemistry Department entitled "Structural Genomics Of Pathogenic Protozoa." The purpose of the project is to determine crystal structures of proteins from tropical pathogenic protozoa. Those under study are the causative agent of sleeping sickness in Africa, ones that are responsible for Ghagas' Disease in Latin America, ones that cause various forms of leishmaniasis throughout the tropics and subtropics and ones that cause the most lethal form of malaria. Research to define new therapeutic targets will aid in the discovery of better treatments for these wide spread debilitating diseases.





