

MAY HIGHLIGHTS

The United States Army Medical Research and Materiel Command awarded a grant in the amount of \$433,565 for a project under the direction of Professor Patrick S. Stayton of the Bioengineering Department entitled "Smart Polymeric Carriers for Enhanced Antisense Breast Cancer Therapy." This research involves the design and synthesis of "smart" polymer carriers that direct and enhance the intracellular delivery of therapeutic antisense oligodeoxynucleotides (ASODN) in breast cancer cells leading to significantly enhanced breast cancer therapy. The hypothesis is that this delivery method will cause cell death, regression of tumor size and increase survival rates.

The Health Resources and Services Administration awarded a three year renewal grant in the amount of \$676,192 for a project under the direction of Assistant Dean David A. Acosta of the School Of Medicine entitled "Health Careers Opportunities Program (HCOP)." The goal of this program is to assist individuals from disadvantaged background to enter and graduate from a health or allied health professional program. It also helps transition entering medical students into the medical school curriculum. The HCOP supports a comprehensive regional approach to health careers recruitment and retention in the states of Washington, Wyoming, Alaska, Montana and Idaho.
