

The National Institutes of Health awarded a grant in the amount of \$204,750 for a project under the direction of Associate Professor Jing Zhang of the Department of Pathology entitled "Detecting Biomarkers in Plasma for Diagnosing Neurodegenerative Diseases." The clinical diagnosis of most neurodegenerative disorders, including Alzheimer's disease (AD) and Parkinson's disease (PD), currently relies on the analysis of symptoms and signs, limited laboratory tests, and more recently, brain imaging. In general, clinical diagnostic accuracy of various neurodegenerative diseases as determined by pathological examination falls between 50-85%, depending on the disease involved and the experience of the physician. The purpose of this project is to address the urgent need for alternative approaches that are complementary and/or can provide greater selectivity and accuracy for disease diagnosis, especially at preclinical stage. The goal of this project is to apply a mass spectrometry based targeted quantitative proteomics approach to quantitatively detect and verify in human plasma the biomarkers associated with AD and PD the research team has previously found in cerebrospinal fluid. Successful completion of this project could lead to the development of patient-friendly sensitive assays that can assist with clinical diagnosis of AD and PD, as well as monitoring the progression of the diseases or effects of current therapeutic reagents.

The Puget Sound Partners for Global Health awarded a grant in the amount of \$74,992 for a project under the direction of Professor Yongmin Kim of the Department of Bioengineering entitled "Improving Maternal Healthcare in Developing Countries." Every year, eight million women, the vast majority from developing countries, suffer from pregnancy-related complications. The purpose of this project is to improve maternal heath through a new healthcare paradigm relying on low-cost medical devices, an Emedicine platform for exchanging information, and expert clinicians willing to consult with the local clinics that can overcome the inadequate healthcare infrastructures in developing nations. The goal of the project is to evaluate this new healthcare paradigm by conducting a 1-year pilot study in Africa. The Department of Bioengineering, OB/GYN physicians in the Puget Sound area who have volunteered to act as global experts, and local clinicians in Gambia will together collaborate to leverage their strengths to find a low-cost, effective method towards reducing maternal mortality.




Comparison of Grant & Contract Awards

Fiscal Year


Complete Fiscal Year Comparison of Grant & Contract Awards
