### Nature of Organization

The Danny Woo Community Garden is a green space in the heart of Seattle's International District. This 1.5 acre garden provides an opportunity for low-income elders and children, mostly Asian and Pacific Island immigrants, to grow nutritious food.

### Duties and Responsibilities

The intern's primary responsibility is to provide project management for the design and implementation of an indoor/outdoor cookery for the garden. Responsibilities will include: coordinating and participating in community meetings, collaborating with design professionals to create a design, applying for permits, purchasing materials, supervising work crews, completion of reporting, recruiting volunteers, and construction. Secondly, the intern will assist with garden maintenance and the coordination of garden events. This will include pruning, mulching, weeding, infrastructure repairs, planning, purchasing supplies, recruiting volunteers, and managing volunteers.
