

Monthly Distributive and Cumulative Breakdown of Research Award Dollars, for Last 5 Fiscal Years




Figure 2: Monthly distribution of research award dollars by fiscal year




Figure 3: Monthly cumulative totals of research award dollars by fiscal year

Fiscal Year to Date Research Award Totals by Project Type,³ for Jul-Apr period of Last 5 Fiscal Years



Fiscal Year to Date Research Award Totals by Originating Sponsor⁴Federal Status, for Jul-Apr period of Last 5 Fiscal Years



Fiscal Year to Date Research Award Totals by Originating Sponsor,⁴ for Jul-Apr 2016




