### Nature of Organization

The Able Teens (TAT) is an after school job and life skill training program for youth and young adults ages 15-24 with developmental disabilities including autism. TAT uses service learning opportunities to help youth reach personal, academic or professional goals.

### Duties and Responsibilities

Provide on the job coaching and mentoring to teens (aged 14-25) with developmental/intellectual disabilities in community centers, food banks, libraries, and community based organizations. Assist the teens in learning universal job skills (i.e. punctuality, task management, etc.) that will better prepare them for employment in the community. Work with the individuals, their families, teachers, support workers and community organizations with the intent of building a support structure around the individual so that they may explore their own self-sufficiency and develop meaningful vocational experience.

### Minimum Qualifications

Awareness and appreciation of individuals with developmental disabilities, must be awarded state or federal work study funds, willing to travel to Jefferson or Bitter Lake community center, desire to work with youth, desire to work on a professional and supportive team, ability to teach and model tasks, clear communication skills, outside the box/ creative thinking and the ability to be self directed at times.
