STUDENT INSURANCE

All students who do not specifically request a particular student insurance plan or who do not specifically state they do not wish student insurance, will automatically be enrolled and billed for student only medical, surgical, and hospital insurance.

If you are billed for student insurance and wish to cancel your coverage, complete the appropriate section on the remittance copy of the billing statement and pay the amount billed less the indicated amount for insurance.

International students must subscribe to the University's medical insurance. Exceptions may be granted by the International Services Office if the student presents proof of other medical insurance coverage.

WASHPIRG

An optional \$2 fee is indicated on the fee statement for the Washington Public Interest Research Group, a student research organization. If you do not desire to support this activity, simply pay the regular tuition and fees. If you want to support WASHPIRG, check the payment card and pay the regular tuition and fees plus \$2.

WITHDRAWAL FROM THE UNIVERSITY (DROPPING ALL COURSES FOR THE QUARTER)

1. Obtain an approved withdrawal form from your adviser.
2. Present the withdrawal form to the Withdrawal Office, Sections, 264 Schmitz Hall. Withdrawals are effective the date they are received in the Registrar's Office. Fees owed will be based upon the date the withdrawal is received in the Registrar's Office. No withdrawals will be accepted after the last day of instruction, June 6.

The fee schedule below will be followed.

Continuing Students

- a. Students withdrawing before the sixth day of the quarter do not pay tuition or fees.
- b. Students withdrawing on the sixth day or through the thirtieth calendar day continue to owe one-half of their tuition and fees.
- c. Students withdrawing after the thirtieth calendar day receive no refund of tuition or fees.

New and Returning Students

- a. Students withdrawing before the sixth day of the quarter forfeit their \$50 enrollment service fee.
- b. Students withdrawing on the sixth day or through the thirtieth calendar day of the quarter must pay one-half of regular tuition and fees or forfeit the \$50 enrollment service charge, whichever is greater.
- c. Students who withdraw officially after the thirtieth calendar day must pay full tuition and fees, which includes the \$50 enrollment service fee.

3. Students who were unable to turn in their withdrawal in time may petition the Comptroller's Office for additional refund. Petition forms are available at the Student Accounts Office, 129 Schmitz Hall.

4. Courses dropped as part of a University withdrawal completed during the first two weeks of a quarter receive no grade and no entry. Withdrawals completed after the first two weeks result in the courses being assigned a grade of "W."

GRADING SYSTEM

The University of Washington uses a numerical grading system, with certain exceptions in the schools of Dentistry, Law, and Medicine. Instructors may report grades from 4.0 to 0.7 in 0.1 increments and the grade 0.0. The number 0.0 is assigned for failing work or unofficial withdrawal. Grades in the range 0.6 to 0.1 may not be assigned. Grades reported in this range for undergraduates will be converted by the Registrar's Office to 0.0. For graduate students, grades reported in the range 1.6-0.1 will be converted to 0.0. Numerical grades may be considered equivalent to letter grades as follows:

The Grade of Incomplete

In order to obtain credit for a course in which an Incomplete has been awarded, an undergraduate student must complete the remaining work for the course by the last day of the following quarter. An Incomplete grade for a Spring Quarter course must be made up by the last day of Autumn Quarter or the Incomplete will be converted to a grade of 0.0 by the Registrar, unless the instructor has indicated when assigning the Incomplete grade that a grade other than 0.0 should be recorded if the incomplete work is not completed. This time limitation may be extended up to one year with instructor approval. Such approval must be received by the Registrar's Office before the end of the next quarter.

A graduate student who receives an Incomplete must complete the remaining work for the course by the last day of the next quarter in residence. An Incomplete received by a graduate student does not automatically convert to 0.0 but remains an Incomplete if the course work is not completed. This time limitation may be waived by the dean of the college in which the course was offered only if the nature of the uncompleted work is such as to make the fulfillment of this requirement impossible. In no case can an Incomplete received by a graduate student be converted to a passing grade after a lapse of two years. The Incomplete grade entry remains on the record permanently. When the final grade is received it is posted under the quarter in which it is received.

Satisfactory/Not Satisfactory

Students may elect to take certain courses on a Satisfactory/Not Satisfactory basis. Advisers should be consulted and in no case are students allowed to register for more than one course or 6 credits on a Satisfactory/Not Satisfactory basis in a given quarter. No more than 25 credits will apply to an undergraduate degree. S/NS must be elected or dropped during the official change of program period. Undergraduate students earning grades of 1.7 or above receive a grade of S (Satisfactory) while grades below 1.7 are recorded as NS (Not Satisfactory). Graduate students earning grades of 2.7 or above receive a grade of S (Satisfactory), while 2.6 or below are NS (Not Satisfactory). In cases of withdrawal, the W is recorded. Neither S nor NS are included in the grade-point average. N, I, and X are recorded until the instructor reports the final grade, or in cases of incompletes received by undergraduates, until the I is converted by the Registrar. With the approval of his or her Graduate Program Adviser or Supervisory Committee Chairman, a graduate student may elect to take any course for which he or she is eligible outside of his or her major academic unit on the Satisfactory/Not Satisfactory system.

Credit/No Credit-Only Courses

Some courses are offered on a CR/NC-only basis. These courses may be taken only on this basis and it is not necessary to be in the special Credit/No Credit program to take these courses. It is not necessary to register S/NS to take these courses as the only grades assigned by the instructor are CR (Credit) or NC (No Credit). Neither CR nor NC are included in the grade-point average. In cases of withdrawal a 'W' is recorded. N, I, and X are recorded until the instructor reports the final grade, or in cases of incompletes received by undergraduates, until the I is converted by the Registrar.

Credit/No Credit Program

The University offers an undergraduate grading option called Credit/No Credit. Students entering this program automatically take all courses on a CR/NC basis. This program is not applicable to certain degrees and advisers should be consulted. Students must enter and exit the CR/NC program no later than the last day of the change of program period for the quarter the change is to be effective. Change of registration appointments available at Window 2 or 3, second floor of Schmitz Hall, for students who have received a schedule of classes. Engineering majors go to 353 Loew. Students will be expected to present UW Spring 1980 student ID cards when requesting appointments. Evening-only students may change their program without an appointment any time after 5 p.m. and no later than 6:15 p.m. during the first week of school. Evening-only students should go directly to sections in the Undergraduate Library (use cafeteria entrance).

OFFICIAL CHANGE OF REGISTRATION PERIOD by appointment only, at the Sections branch office, Odegaard Undergraduate Library (use cafeteria entrance), for students who have received a schedule of classes. Engineering majors go to 353 Loew.

IN-PERSON REGISTRATION by appointment only (note application closing dates above) at the Sections branch office, Odegaard Undergraduate Library (use cafeteria entrance), for matriculated students. Engineering majors go to 353 Loew.

IN-PERSON REGISTRATION FOR NONMATRICULATED STUDENTS, by appointment only, at the Sections branch office, Odegaard Undergraduate Library (use cafeteria entrance).

IN-PERSON REGISTRATION FOR TUITION-EXEMPT FACULTY/STAFF at the Sections branch office, Odegaard Undergraduate Library (use cafeteria entrance). See page iii for appointment times which are assigned according to last name.

OFFICIAL CHANGE OF REGISTRATION PERIOD by appointment only, at the Sections branch office, Odegaard Undergraduate Library (engineering majors at 353 Loew) for all students.

Deadline for: (1) changes to or from S/NS grading or CR/NC program; (2) adding a course without instructor's permission; (3) adding or dropping a course without being assessed a \$5 change fee. Courses dropped after this date will be included in the tuition calculation. (See refund schedule under Dropping and Adding Courses on page iv). Change fee of \$5 will be assessed after this date.

Last day for official withdrawal from the University without owing tuition or fees.

Last day to drop a course without entry on permanent record.

Last day to add a course without dean's permission. (Arts and Sciences students do not need permission of the dean to add a class at any time during the quarter.)

Fee statements mailed to all registered students.

Last day for undergraduate, postbaccalaureate (fifth-year), and nonmatriculated students to drop a course.

Fee payment deadline for all registered students.

Final examination should be administered in accordance with the above examination schedule.

The dean may permit an instructor to change the time of a final examination upon prior application demonstrating good cause for such change. In such cases, the following guidelines shall be observed.

1. With the dean's permission, the final examination may be postponed or moved to an earlier time within the examination period if agreed to by all students and the instructor. Before approving the rescheduling of a final examination, the dean shall obtain assurances that the change will not have an undue adverse impact on the students. The dean shall notify the Registrar of the approval granted for changing the date of a final examination.
2. An instructor shall not, except in very unusual circumstances, grant permission to individual students for an early examination. If the student is unable to take an examination on the scheduled date, the procedure outlined in the following paragraph should be followed.
3. A student absent from any examination, or other required class activity, either by permission of the dean or through sickness or other unavoidable cause, shall be given an opportunity to complete the required work, or its equivalent, at some other time. If

the instructor determines this is not feasible during the current quarter, the instructor shall exempt the student from the requirement or give the student a grade of Incomplete if his or her work in the course is otherwise satisfactory. The student may remove this Incomplete in the manner provided for the removal of Incomplete grades. In all other cases of absence from the scheduled final examination, a student should be given a grade of 0.0.

4. Classes that meet on the hour use the first full hour of instruction to determine the time of examination. For example, a class that meets at 10 a.m. uses the 10:30 a.m. examination time.
5. Classes that begin on the half hour and last longer than one hour use the actual starting time to determine the exam time. For example, a class that meets at 7:30 a.m. and continues until 9 a.m. would use the 7:30 time.
6. Classes in which the entire class meets at the same hour every day, in the same room, may use that room at 8:30 or 2:30 for a three-hour examination. All other exams are limited to one hour and fifty minutes unless other arrangements are made with Room Assignments.
7. If an examination is held at a time other than the above schedule indicates, instructors must check with Room Assignments to make sure that the room is going to be available.

NEW COURSES FOR SPRING QUARTER 1980

The following list includes new courses that will be offered Spring Quarter 1980, which were added to the University curriculum after publication of the 1978-80 *General Catalog*. Consult the ap-

propriate academic department for information on courses not listed below.

COLLEGE OF ARCHITECTURE AND URBAN PLANNING

LANDSCAPE ARCHITECTURE

L ARC 474 Project Design (6)

Detailed design studies of small to medium-scale projects. General focus on public landscape areas and social/psychological uses of sites, design master plan and details, planting and construction documents, and professional office presentation of material. Prerequisite: fifth year standing in the department or permission of instructor.

L ARC 522 Landscape Technology (3)

Lecture/seminar on design philosophy and construction technology related to landscape habitat development. Technologies and their appropriateness for rehabilitation, restoration, and creation of landscapes at site specific scale, maintenance programs, energy conservation, implementation problems and public policy. To be taken concurrently with 523. Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

L ARC 523 Landscape Technology (3)

Studio on application of technologies and their appropriateness for rehabilitation, restoration, and creation of landscapes at site specific scale. Examination of maintenance programs, energy conservation, implementation problems and public policy. To be taken concurrently with 522. Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

URBAN PLANNING

URB P 468 Land Use From Satellite Data (3)

Digital data from Landsat, etc., are used to determine land use and landcover classification in urban and rural areas. "Hands-on" exercises on computer. Photointerpretation, statistics, land use classification and verification are incorporated. Prerequisite: 465, 467 or permission of instructor.

URB P 471 History of Urban Design (3)

Focus on aspects of form, pattern, and space which mark efforts of individuals and groups to express their values and goals in the design of their cities. Special attention given to both historical and modern examples.

COLLEGE OF ARTS AND SCIENCES

AMERICAN INDIAN STUDIES

AIS 170 Survey of North American Indian Art (5)

Major American Indian art traditions of North America. Pre-contact and early contact era traditions, and the evolution of Indian art forms in contemporary times. Design and technique in Indian art.

AIS 253 Wood Design (3, max. 9)

Studio course emphasizing the fundamentals of wood sculpture. Shaping and forming of wood utilizing Northwest Indian hand tools. Properties of various woods and their uses. Prerequisites: ART 101

or equivalent, and permission. Not open to students who have credit in AIS 475.

AIS 310 A Linguistic Approach to Culture (3)

Analytical study of a language with special focus on native Indian languages of North America. Analysis of sound systems of languages and a universal system of classifying and writing speech sounds. Emphasis on practical application, with time devoted to sound transcription practice. Students master basic skills, choose a language for extended study, and learn to transcribe its sounds. Not open to students who have credit in 475.

AIS 340 Indian Children and Families (3)

Survey of the psychosocial development of the Indian child and family. Historical changes in family structure, value orientations, and social adaptations to a bicultural environment. Prerequisite: junior standing.

ANTHROPOLOGY

ANTH 230 Comparative Tribal Religion (5)

Deals with the world's "folk" or "little traditions" of religious belief and practice. Cosmologies, eschatologies, notions of causality and of human nature. Presents these "little traditions" as examples of man's imaginative attempts to create a relatively "closed", "knowable" and more-or-less manageable cosmos.

ANTH 302 Plants, Animals, and People (3)

Emphasis on the knowledge of and attitudes toward plants and animals of non-Western peoples. Role of resource species as food and medicine and in tool manufacture, myth, and ritual. Hunters and gatherers, fishermen, pastoralists, and agriculturalists studied in comparison with contemporary Western societies.

ANTH 489 Anthropology Practicum (3-9, max. 15)

Faculty supervised off-campus internships in organizations where anthropological skills may be utilized in non-academic settings. Assistance with establishing educationally valuable individual projects for internships given by faculty sponsor. Suitable intern organizations include museums, social service and other government agencies, and private non-profit service agencies. Prerequisites: Major in Anthropology and instructor's permission.

ANTH 498 Seminar on Recent Advances in Medical and Psychiatric Anthropology (3)

Includes: comparative studies of medical systems; cultural construction of illness categories and behaviors; health seeking behavior; comparisons of indigenous and cosmopolitan practitioner-patient transactions; cross-cultural studies of the healing process; cultural analysis of affective and behavioral disorders; and applied clinical relevance of anthropological concepts and findings. Offered jointly with PBSCI 497. Prerequisites: 321 and permission of instructor.

ANTH 592 Seminar in Museum Specimen Documentation (3)

Seminar discussion of museum specimen documentation research approaches, including technological and raw material analyses, contextual studies, and aesthetic studies. Documentation of a collection and reference work will be integral to the course. Prerequisites: 590, 591, or instructor's permission.

Archaeology

ARCHY 468 Issues in Cultural Resource Management (1)

Review of federal and state cultural resource management policies and the effects of these policies on the conduct of projects which may impact cultural resources on public lands. Survey of related issues in museum management. Prerequisite: 205, ANTH 202, or permission.

Physical Anthropology

PHY A 375 Biology of Human Race (3)

World-wide survey of the distribution and causes of variation in human biology: the distribution of human body shape and size, skin and eye color, genetic systems such as blood groups, and responses to cold, heat, and disease; their relation to processes of adaptation and natural selection, environment, and population history; and problems arising from previous attempts at classifying human variability. Prerequisite: 201 or permission.

PHY A 590 Current Issues in Human and Non-Human Primate Evolution (1, max. 15)

Bi-weekly presentation by participants and guest lecturers of current literature and ongoing research in topics pertaining to human and non-human primate evolution, biology, anatomy, genetics variation, and behavior. Prerequisite: required of graduate students in physical anthropology; others by permission of instructor.

ART

ART 200 Art and the Child (3)

Introductory orientation to art, designed to acquaint the student with the structural and esthetic elements of art and those art-related processes of self-expression and communication basic to a child's general education.

ART 231 Introductory Photography II (3)

Introduction to basic black and white darkroom procedures, equipment, and techniques. Emphasis on both darkroom printing and the camera. Student must provide camera with lens, shutter, and aperture controls. Prerequisite: 230 or permission of instructor.

ART 232 Theory and Criticism of Photography (3)

Study of photography based on its origins and development as an art form from early nineteenth century to the present day. Emphasis on photographic traditions and photographers of the twentieth century.

ART 371 Intermediate Photography II (5)

The photo essay. A thematic investigation of time and space using the photographic image. In-depth treatment of a single topic. Prerequisites: 231 and permission.

Art History

ART H 305 Introduction to Islamic Art and Civilization (5)

Islamic art and civilization as represented by five court cities (Cairo, Cordova-Granada, Istanbul, Isfahan, Delhi-Fatehpur-Sikri) and the art and architecture, literature, religious expression, and social modes characteristic of each. Field trips to various local collections.

ART H 408 Royal Images: Byzantium, Sasanid Iran, Islam (3)

Signs and symbols of royal kingship in Byzantium, Sasanid Iran, and Islam; three major Middle Eastern dynasties organized on principles of religious ideology; origins of royal symbols and their iconography in Mesopotamian and classical culture.

ASIAN LANGUAGES AND LITERATURE

ASIAN 263 Great Works of Asian Literature (5)

Introduction to selected major works of Asian literature. Taught on a rotational basis with the literary traditions of China, Japan, India, etc. covered in successive years. Content will vary depending on specialization and interest of instructor. Primary emphasis is on literary values of works and their tradition; attention is also given to historical and social contexts and the thought and value systems of the culture involved.

Japanese

JAPAN 463 Advanced Japanese Readings (3)

Directed readings and translation of modern Japanese prose selections in fields reflecting interests of students related to language, linguistics, and the social sciences. Prerequisite: 313 or equivalent or permission.

ASIAN AMERICAN STUDIES

AAS 350 Chinese American History and Culture (3)

Experience of the Chinese in America from 1850 to the present. Special attention to the transformative process from an immigrant community to an ethnic society. Immigration pattern and problems. Racism and the anti-Chinese movement. Ethnic socio-political and economic institutions. Community issues. Chinese American culture. Ethnic politics involving the community. China and America. Local variations in Chinese America. Prerequisite: 205 or equivalent, or permission of instructor.

BIOLOGY

BIOL 592 Instructional Skills for Science Teaching Assistants (1)

Emphasis on the improvement of each student's basic teaching skills. Videotaping analysis of student's presentations.

BLACK STUDIES

BLK S 230 Resources in Afro-American Research I (3)

Compilation of annotated subject bibliography of Black Studies topics, with emphasis on secondary sources, general reference sources and social sciences.

BLK S 280 Creative Expression for African-American Children (5)

Explores new and developing theories and practices of creative expression for African-American children. Prerequisite: 200.

BLK S 301 Community Practice (3-5, max. 15)

Internship in various Seattle community service agencies (i.e., CAMP, Planned Parenthood, etc.). Students contribute their newly acquired skills and knowledge to the Black community. Experience gained in working with professional community organizers. Junior or senior standing recommended.

BLK S 310 Philosophy of West Africa (3)

Bantu and Yoruba philosophical systems in the context of cultural relativism. Belief systems as an adaptive tool for solving social and environmental problems. African philosophy as an aesthetic system, approached from an historical and cross-cultural perspective.

BLK S 400 The Black Aesthetic (3)

The Black Aesthetic as distinct from the mainstream of American culture. Problems and issues of being Black in America. Focuses on the various art forms (i.e., theatre, music and literature) from an historical, social and political perspective. Special emphasis on the theatre, music and literature.

BOTANY

BOT 574 Physiological Plant Ecology (5) Sp

Theory and practice of the measurement of important environmental variables in plant ecology (radiation, temperature, light, wind, humidity) and the basic responses of the plants. Some aspects of plant interactions, especially allelopathy; primary emphasis will be on reactions of the individual plant, with some implications to ecosystems included. Prerequisite: introductory courses in plant physiology and plant ecology.

CHEMISTRY

CHEM 436 Introductory Bioorganic Chemistry (3)

Topics in biosynthetic chemistry. Emphasis on primary metabolic products (α -amino acids, carbohydrates, fatty acids, Krebs cycle intermediates, mevalonic acid) and secondary natural products (acetogenins, alkaloids, flavonoids, steroids). Prerequisite: 236 or 337.

COMMUNICATIONS

CMU 304 The Press and Politics (3)

Journalist's role in elections and public policy. Relationship between news coverage and political campaigns. Requires study and analysis of local political news writing, reporting and response by local and state political figures. Extensive off-campus experience is included. Offered jointly with POL S 304. (Last quarter offered: Spring, 1981.)

CMU 415 Production Editing (4)

The editorial role in the preparation of scientific and technical materials for production (typesetting, layout, printing, binding, distribution). The editor's responsibilities and prerogatives as they relate to those of other professionals in the production end of the publications field. Offered jointly with STC 415. Prerequisite: STC 402 or permission of instructor.

COMPARATIVE LITERATURE

C LIT 240 Writing in Comparative Literature (5)

Comparative approach to literature and a workshop in writing comparative papers. Emphasis on cross-cultural comparison of literary masterpieces. Readings in English with an option to read selected texts in the original language (French, German, Italian, Russian, Spanish, or a Scandinavian language - varies each quarter). Writing in English. Basic reading knowledge of one of the above languages recommended.

COMPUTER SCIENCE

C SCI 445 Computer Programming Laboratory (1)

Focus on experienced computer programmers who want to learn Pascal quickly. Topics include the syntax and semantics of Pascal along with programming examples. Taught in a concentrated fashion during the first two weeks of the quarter with a number of programming assignments. No credit allowed if 241 has been taken. Offered on credit/no credit basis only. Prerequisite: significant programming experience in a high-level language such as ALGOL, FORTRAN, BASIC, COBOL, or PL/I.

C SCI 499 Reading and Research (1-24, max. 24)

Available for special cases of advanced computer science majors to do reading and research in the field. Offered on credit/no credit basis only. Prerequisites: senior standing and permission of instructor.

DANCE

DANCE 109 Beginning Dance Techniques (3)

Team taught class in Ballet and Modern/Contemporary Dance Technique. Basic concepts and elements of each idiom taught by a teacher specializing in that idiom; the technique of both idioms taught with an awareness of their relationships and their differences. Prerequisite: 108 for 109, or permission of instructor.

DANCE 250 Exploring the Articulate Body (3)

Basic body connections and joint articulations. Principles of dynamic body alignment, apatterning efficient lines of muscular use, weight initiation, connections from lower body support to upper body freedom. Based on the Bartenieff Fundamentals as developed by the Laban Institute of Movement. Prerequisites: permission of instructor and concurrent registration in a basic dance technique course.

DANCE 254 Effort/Shape (3)

Laban's Effort/Shape concepts. What makes movement expressive, how to see movement textures clearly, how to broaden the dynamic range of one's movements. Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

DANCE 271 Choreographic Workshop (2, max. 6)

Logical extension of the basic dance techniques, folk-ethnic, and special techniques classes, in order to provide a performing experience for students enrolled in any of these classes. Prerequisite: enrollment in basic technique class, folk-ethnic or special techniques class.

DANCE 471 University of Washington Dance Theatre (3)

A performing company for advanced level students. Open only by audition and/or invitation of the Artistic Director. Maintains a seven hour a week rehearsal schedule with regularly scheduled performances during the academic year. Prerequisites: audition and permission of instructor.

DRAMA

DRAMA 265 Black Theatre Workshop (3)

Studio course using Black arts materials which introduces the student to basic skills and techniques associated with performance, while also developing self-awareness and confidence. Prerequisite: 202 or concurrent registration, or permission of instructor.

DRAMA 373 History of the Western Theatre and Its Literature: 1700-1941 (5)

Theatre history and dramatic literature of Europe, England, and America. Development of the modern playhouse, and of modern dramatic and critical theory. The growth of the actor-manager and star systems; emergence of the director. Theatrical production and its response to Romanticism and Realism, to Melodrama, social drama, and musical theatre forms. Primarily for drama majors; open to others with a background in the history and/or literature of the period.

DRAMA 337 Fundamentals of Creative Dramatics (3)

Introduction to concepts and principles of creative dramatics. Intensive personal involvement in activities and exercises which illuminate the foundations of learning through drama. Emphasis on sensory awareness, play theory, creativity, and playmaking through improvisation. Prerequisite: 230 or permission of instructor.

DRAMA 435 Theatre in the Schools (3)

Practical experiences in researching, devising, rehearsing, and presenting actor/teacher, theatre-in-education programs to groups of school children in the Seattle area. Programs pertinent to school curriculum or to a particular group of children involve both performance by actors and participation of children. Prerequisite: 253 or permission of instructor.

DRAMA 532 Management Principles for Children's Theatre (3)

Provides theoretical and practical approach to management of children's theatre and related children's arts programs. Special focus on demands of touring companies, liaison with schools, season selection, publicity, fund-raising, budgets, community relationships, and the need for a philosophy of management. Prerequisite: graduate standing.

DRAMA 535 Graduate Colloquium in Child Drama (1, max. 6)

Analysis, discussion, and critique of special studies, productions, research and thesis projects being done in the field of child drama by graduate students in the School of Drama. Prerequisite: graduate standing or permission of instructor.

ECONOMICS

ECON 538 Economic Aspects of Marine Policy II (3)

Offered jointly with IMS 538. See IMS 538 for course description and prerequisite.

ECON 547 Advanced Seminar in Health Economics (3)

Offered jointly with HSERV 560. See HSERV 560 for course description and prerequisite.

ENGLISH

ENGL 495H Major Conference for Honors in Creative Writing (5)

Special projects available to honors students in

creative writing. Required of, and limited to, honors students in creative writing.

ENGL 501 The Renaissance and Literary Tradition (5)

Examination of selected texts from 1500 to 1750, concentrating on specific problems of interpretation and scholarship characteristic of the study of works written before 1750.

ENGL 504 Approaches to Teaching Composition (5)

Teaching experience, combined with readings in composition theory and discussion of practical classroom applications. Prerequisite: previous experience or concurrent assignment in teaching writing.

ENGL 557 Research Methods in Second Language Acquisition (5)

Intensive examination of research and testing methodology in second-language acquisition and learning. On the basis of this examination, students design and execute studies relevant to their own interests in the field. Prerequisites: 556, LING 449, or permission of instructor.

ENGL 584 Advanced Fiction Workshop (5, max. 10)

Advanced seminar in the craft of fiction, with professional focus on the planning, writing, and revising of a publishable work preliminary to the graduate thesis. Prerequisite: graduate standing.

ENGL 590-591 Master's Essay (5-6, max. 11)

Two quarter research and writing project under the close supervision of a faculty member expert in that field of study. Work is independent and will vary; one quarter of the project will be used for background reading and research and the other quarter for presentation of an original thesis in written form. The finished project will be read by the supervisor and by a second reader.

ENVIRONMENTAL STUDIES

ENV S 532 Internship Seminar (3)

Post-internship seminar with focus on a detailed analytical paper concerning the role of science in analysis and decision making in the agency or firm in which the student served as intern. Prerequisites: 530, 531. (Last time offered: Autumn, 1981.)

GEOGRAPHY

GEOG 495 Special Topics (*, max. 10)

Topics vary and are announced in the preceding quarter. Prerequisite: permission.

GEOLOGY

GEOG 561 Seminar in Geological Fluid Mechanics (3)

Reading and discussion of topics of current interest in geological fluid mechanics. Course work includes a report on a specialized topic. Offered jointly with OCEAN 561. Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

GEOPHYSICS

GPHYS 499 Independent Study for Undergraduates (1-5, max. 10)

Prerequisite: permission.

HISTORY

HST 210. The Idea of Nature in Western Civilization (5)

The concept of nature as a historical product of successive cultural periods in the Western tradition. Analysis of different perceptions of man's relation to, and place in nature, from the Pre-Socratics to the present.

HST 251. The Role of the Low Countries in the Creation of Modern Europe (3)

Culture of medieval Flanders; Reformation and overthrow of Spanish rule; Golden Age of Dutch culture and power. Recommended: IL2. (Offered Spring quarter, 1980 only.)

HST 467 Nations and States in the Modern World (5)

Development of national consciousness in the "Old nations" of Europe before the French Revolution. Replacement by new nationalism, spreading into East Central Europe, Russia, Ibero-America, Asia, and Africa.

HST 470 Medieval Jewish History (5)

Social and intellectual history of the Jews in Western Europe to the 15th century. Jews under Islam and Christianity; the Church and the Jews; the Crusades and their legacy; intellectual achievements; conflict and cooperation.

HST 471 History of the Jews in Eastern Europe (5)

Jews in Eastern Europe, from the Khazars to the Holocaust.

HONORS-- ARTS & SCIENCES

H A&S -201 Humanistic Understanding and Human Culture (-3)

Study of a topic related to linguistic, artistic, or other humanistic activities as ways of knowing, methods of inquiry, and systems of cultural association and exchange. (Last time offered: Spring Quarter, 1981.)

INTERNATIONAL STUDIES

SIS 301 War (5)

Origins and conduct of war; readings from anthropology, political science, economics, and history, as well as two novels and some recent articles on the arms control controversy. Modern forms of warfare, including guerrilla war, world war, and nuclear war. Offered jointly with SOC 301.

SIS 401 Peasant Agriculture in Asia (5)

Comparative study of peasant agriculture in Japan, China, India. Historical process of integration into world economy. Contemporary efforts to raise productivity. Political role of peasantry through these two phases. Prerequisite: ECON 200, or one course on Asia, or permission of instructor. (Offered Spring Quarter, 1980 only.)

SIS 420 Energy Politics in International Perspective (5)

Relationship of energy, the economy, and political process. Focus on comparing policy response to energy crisis made by a number of nations, and an exploration of the prospects for domestic and international cooperation and conflict that problems of energy interdependence raise.

SIS 448 Franklin D. Roosevelt and his World, 1882-1945 (3)

Life and times of the 32nd President of the United States, with emphasis on American foreign relations --especially the role FDR played in the emergence of the United States as a world power. Offered jointly with HST 448.

East Asia

SISEA 234 Man, Morality and the State in Chinese History (5)

Introduction to perennial themes in the thought of South and East Asia. Content and emphasis vary (for example, China or India, classical or modern, political or cosmological thought).

Russia and Eastern Europe

SISRE 248 Multi-ethnic States in the Soviet Union and Eastern Europe (5)

Nationality and multi-ethnic problems in the Soviet Union and East European states. Relevance and irrelevance of Marxist theory as applied to this problem.

Comparative Religion

RELIG 315 Modern Judaism (5)

Development of Jewish religious thought since the mid-eighteenth century, focusing on development of Jewish Enlightenment, Reform, Conservative, Neo-Orthodox, and Reconstructionist movements. Evaluation of religious responses to the Holocaust and the rise of the state of Israel. Recommended background: 201 or 210.

RELIG 352 Hinduism (3)

Survey of the varieties of Hindu religious practice; emphasis on the diverse patterns of religious thought and action among contemporary Hindus; topics include ritual behavior, village Hinduism, tantrism, sadhus, yoga, sects, the major gods and their mythologies, religious art, and the adjustments of Hinduism to modernity. Recommended preparation: 202 or other study of South Asia culture.

KINESIOLOGY

KIN 200 Foundations of Physical Fitness (3)

Concepts, theories, principles, and practices of physical conditioning. Evaluation of contemporary physical conditioning programs and development of a personal fitness regimen. Completion of previous courses in biological science desirable. Not open to physical education majors.

KIN 512 Sport in a Liberal Democracy (U.S.A.) (5)

Critical analysis of the recent transformations in sport within the broader context of industrial capitalism's maturation and ideologies. Specific attention is paid to the U.S.A. Prerequisite: 302, or permission of instructor. (SOC 410 or SOC 451 recommended.) (Last quarter offered: Spring, 1983.)

KINPE 437 Advanced Athletic Training (5)

Advanced procedures in athletic training and injury rehabilitation. Consideration for safety factors in athletic contests, sports equipment, and facilities. Theory and practice in the use of therapeutic modalities for injury rehabilitation. Prerequisites: 331, 332, 336.

KINPE 503 Seminar in Sport Administration (1, max. 3)

Issues and problems in the management of sport

programs and facilities. Offered on a credit/no credit basis only. Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

KINPE 504 Seminar in Exercise Science (1, max. 3)

Current practice methods in athletic training and/or exercise prescription for cardio-pulmonary conditioning. Offered on a credit/no credit basis only. Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

KINPE 595 Internship in Sport Administration (3-6, max. 12)

Supervised field experience. Nine hours minimum, eighteen hours maximum per week. Open to graduate students in M.S. Physical Education Sport Administration option only. Offered on a credit/no credit basis only. Prerequisites: concurrent registration in 503 and permission of instructor.

KINPE 596 Intern Exercise Science (3-6, max. 12)

Supervised field/clinic experience. Nine hours minimum, eighteen hours maximum per week. Open to graduate students in M.S. Physical Education Sports Medicine option only. Offered on a credit/no credit basis only. Prerequisites: concurrent registration in 504 and permission of instructor.

MATHEMATICS

MATH 239 Elements of Differential Equations (3)

Continuation of 238. Laplace transforms, linear systems, stability theory. Prerequisites: 238, and either 205 or 303.

MUSIC

MUSIC 162 American Popular Song (5)

Historical, social, and stylistic study of popular idioms from the late 19th century to the present. Most attention to contemporary idioms (rock, country-western, soul, disco). Influences of music industry on taste and style. Does not include jazz, blues, or folk music. Primarily for non-majors. 160 and 161 recommended.

MUSIC 307 Advanced Opera Workshop (1)

Preparation and public performance of one-act chamber operas and/or scenes from the standard opera repertoire. Intended for the mature student with a secure vocal technique. Prerequisite: permission of instructor; three quarters of 107 desirable.

NEAR EAST LANGUAGES AND LITERATURE

Hebrew

HEBR 313 Modern Hebrew Literature (3)

Based on 113, Conversational Hebrew, these courses extend into the areas of modern spoken and written Hebrew, newspaper reading, and modern poetry and prose. Prerequisites: 113, or permission of instructor.

NUTRITIONAL SCIENCES AND TEXTILES

Human Nutrition, Dietetics, and Foods

NUTR 468 Food Service Systems Management I (3)

Organization and management of food service systems. Organization of institutions, management tools, and leadership styles. Primarily for students in the Clinical Dietetics program. Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

NUTR 560 Practicum in Dietetic Education (1-5)

Supervised instructional experiences for dietetic education in both classroom and clinical situations. Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

Textile Science and Costume Studies

TSCS 426 Analytical Methods for Textile Evaluation (3)

Qualitative and quantitative procedures specifically developed for analysis of textiles. Application of these methods to fiber content, dyes, finishes, and to performance characteristics of fabrics. Prerequisites: 325, 326, and inorganic and organic chemistry.

TSCS 482 Special Topics in Textile Structures (*)

Recent developments in the field of textile structures. Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

TSCS 483 Special Topics in Historic and Ethnic Costume and Textiles (*)

Recent developments in the field of historic and ethnic costume. Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

TSCS 499 Individualized Study (*)

For undergraduate students. Registrant must have a form from the School of Nutritional Sciences and Textiles, endorsed by the faculty adviser most appropriate for the project proposed. Students are expected to complete a written report explaining the results of their investigations. Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

OCEANOGRAPHY

OCEAN 406 Geological Oceanography Laboratory (2)

Field methods in Geological Oceanography. Collect samples of data using such instruments as echo sounder, seismic reflection profilers, side-scan sonar, grab samplers, corers, sextants, and electronic navigation aids. Produce an integrated report on the sedimentology and stratigraphy of a small area of Puget Sound. Prerequisite: senior or graduate standing in Geological/Geophysical Oceanography or Geological Sciences.

PHILOSOPHY

PHIL 106 Ideas in the Western Tradition (5)

Introduction to cultural issues and ways of thinking in the European traditions since the Renaissance. Organized topically or thematically, drawing from writings in philosophy, literature, science, or other areas. Principal emphasis will usually be given to writings in philosophy. Content and emphasis vary; precise course descriptions available quarterly in advisory offices.

PHYSICS

PHYS 541 Applications of Quantum Physics (4)

Techniques of quantum mechanics applied to lasers, quantum electronics, solids, and surfaces. Emphasis on approximation methods and interaction of electromagnetic radiation with matter. Prerequisite: 421 or 441 or equivalent.

POLITICAL SCIENCE

POL S 301 Special Topics in Political Theory (5, max. 10)

Examines selected contemporary political issues. Political principles as reflected in concrete

political problems. Selected topics might include: women's rights, civil disobedience, national health care, affirmative action, environmental protection, privacy, human rights and redistribution of property. Introductory course in POL 8 at the 100 or 200 level recommended.

POL S 304 The Press and Politics (3)

Journalist's role in elections and public policy. Relationship between news coverage and political campaigns. Requires study and analysis of local political news writing, reporting and response by local and state political figures. Extensive off-campus experience is included. Offered jointly with CMU 304. (Last quarter offered: Spring, 1981.)

POL S 493 Language and Politics (5)

Language as a political phenomenon, tool of political power, and source of political problems. Includes the effects of "public doublespeak", the role of language in racism and sexism, and the search for ways to overcome national and international language barriers in several parts of the world. Primarily for students in political science, languages, and area studies. Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

POL S 496 Undergraduate Internship (5, max. 15)

Restricted to students serving in approved internships. Only five credits may count toward the minimum fifty credits required for the political science major. Prerequisites: sophomore standing or above and permission of undergraduate adviser.

PSYCHOLOGY

PSYCH 304 Issues and Concepts in Community Psychology (4)

Topics include community mental health, epidemiology, program evaluation, and social ecology. Emphasis on research, theory, and practice in community settings and the influence of community-environmental factors in individual functioning and the utilization of these factors in promoting mental health. Prerequisite: 10 credits in psychology.

PSYCH 535 Approaches to Psychological Assessment (4)

Problem-solving approach to psychological assessment; review of psychological tests and procedures and presentation of approaches to their clinical interpretation and use. Required for all graduate majors in clinical and child-clinical psychology. Prerequisite: graduate major standing in clinical psychology.

PSYCH 579 Depression: Diagnosis and Psychological Treatment (2)

Offered jointly with PBSCI 579. See PBSCI 579 for course description and prerequisites.

PSYCH 598 Advanced Clinical Practicum (4)

Supervised psychotherapy involving several individual clients. Separate consultations with supervising instructor for intensive supervision of each case. Occasional meetings in small groups of instructors and students to discuss case material. Assigned readings appropriate to each case with opportunities to discuss these with instructor. Prerequisites: clinical psychology graduate students only and permission.

SCANDINAVIAN LANGUAGES AND LITERATURE

SCAND 260 Scandinavian Cinema (5)

Study of major Scandinavian films and film directors from the 1920s to the present. Course may be taken consecutively (with 261) or independently.

SLAVIC LANGUAGES AND LITERATURE

Russian

RUSS 423 Russian Film and Fiction (5)

Thematic and structural interrelationships of narrative in film and fiction in post-Revolutionary Russia.

SOCIETY AND JUSTICE

SO JU 415 Accounting, Government, and Auditing (3)

Concepts and principles for the accumulation, processing, and reporting of financial information with emphasis on accounting systems, fund accounting, auditing, and criminal investigation of accounting records. Prerequisites: ACCT 210 and junior or senior standing. (Last time offered: Spring, 1982.)

SO JU 420 Organized Crime and Criminal Organization (3)

Focus on criminal conduct involving more than the individual offender acting alone. Examined from the perspectives of: the degree of formal or informal organization present and the permanency of such; bases for development and maintenance of organization; and relative strengths and weaknesses of various organizational groupings. Attention given not only to highly structured organizations, like the continuing criminal conspiracy, but also to more fluid and temporary associations among offenders. Discussion on the specific weaknesses of the criminal justice system. Prerequisite: SOC 371 or 372 or POL S 464. (Last time offered: Spring, 1981.)

SOCIOLOGY

SOC 301 War (5)

Offered jointly with SIS 301. See SIS 301 for course description.

SOC 320 Introduction to Sociological Research (5)

Introduces basic methods of sociological research. Various research strategies such as participant observation, experimentation, and survey research will typically be presented, although the relative emphasis may vary across sections. Major problems in research design such as hypothesis formulation, sampling of subject population, data analysis, and report writing. Introductory course in sociology recommended.

STATISTICS

STAT 311 Elements of Statistical Method (5)

Formerly MATH 281. See General Catalog for course description and prerequisites.

STAT 341 Elementary Probability (3)

Formerly MATH 391. See General Catalog for course description and prerequisites.

STAT 342 Elements of Statistics (3)

Formerly MATH 392. See General Catalog for course description and prerequisites.

STAT 383 Statistical Inference in Applied Research
(5)

Offered jointly with Q SCI 383. See Q SCI 383 in General Catalog for course description and prerequisites.

STAT 395 Probability II (3)

Random variables; expectation and variance; laws of large numbers; normal approximation and other limit theorems; multidimensional distributions and transformations. Offered jointly with MATH 395. Prerequisite: 394.

STAT 396 Probability III (3)

Characteristic functions and generating functions; recurrent events and renewal theory; random walk. Offered jointly with MATH 396. Prerequisite: 395 or 511.

STAT 480 Sampling Theory for Biologists (3)

Offered jointly with Q SCI 480. See Q SCI 480 in General Catalog for course description and prerequisites.

STAT 484 Distribution-Free Inference (3)

Distribution-free methods in estimation, testing; chi-square theory. Prerequisite: 473 or 475. (Formerly MATH 484.)

STAT 485 Analysis of Variance (3)

Formerly MATH 485. See General Catalog for course description and prerequisite.

STAT 523 Advanced Probability (3)

Measure theory and integration, independence, laws of large numbers. Fourier analysis of distributions, central limit problem and infinitely divisible laws, conditional expectations, martingales. Offered jointly with MATH 521, 522, 523. Prerequisite: MATH 426.

STAT 529 Sample Survey Techniques (3)

Offered jointly with BIOST 529. See BIOST 529 in General Catalog for course description and prerequisite.

STAT 543 Nonparametric Statistics (3)

Linear rank statistics; tests of fit; estimation; higher way layouts. Prerequisite: 484.

STAT 573 Statistical Methods for Categorical Data
(3)

Offered jointly with BIOST 573. See BIOST 573 in General Catalog for course description and prerequisites.

STAT 578 Special Topics in Advanced Biostatistics
(3)

Offered jointly with BIOST 578. See BIOST 578 in General Catalog for course description and prerequisite.

STAT 583 Advanced Theory of Statistical Inference
(3)

Formerly MATH 583. See MATH 583 in General Catalog for course description and prerequisites.

BUSINESS ECONOMICS

B ECN 529 Competition Policies in the Context of International Business (3)

Legal and economic analysis of the competition policies of selected developed countries, including the Common Market, the Federal Republic of Germany, the United Kingdom, Japan, Canada, and the United States, with particular reference to the impact of the policies upon the multinational corporation enterprise and international business transactions. Offered jointly with BG&S 555. Prerequisite: entry card.

BUSINESS, GOVERNMENT, & SOCIETY

BG&S 555 Competition Policies in the Context of International Business (3)

Offered jointly with B ECN 529. See B ECN 529 for course description and prerequisite.

INTERNATIONAL BUSINESS

I BUS 580 International Business in Industrialized Countries (3)

Emphasis on understanding the economic, socio-cultural, and political environment in developed, industrialized countries. Problems of international trade and payments relations, economic integration, national policies and supranational organizations' impact on managerial environments. Prerequisite: 550 or equivalent, or course in international economics or trade or international finance, or permission.

SCHOOL OF DENTISTRY

COMMUNITY DENTISTRY

COM D 420 Issues in the Organization and Financing of Dentistry (1)

Topics in health care systems: epidemiology, health care financing; national health insurance; demand for and availability of care; and consumerism. Prerequisite: 400 or third-year status.

ENDODONTICS

ENDO 505 Radiographic Interpretation (2)

Various aspects of radiographic interpretation of particular relevance to Endodontics including: interpretation of normal structures, acquired and developmental abnormalities, infection, cysts, benign tumors, diseases other than tumors.

ENDO 552 Clinical Endodontics (4)

The clinical diagnosis and treatment of the pulpless tooth.

ORAL DIAGNOSIS AND TREATMENT PLANNING

ODTP 449 Directed Studies in Oral Diagnosis (*)

Supplements the offerings of the core curriculum for qualified first- and second-year students; may include dental hygiene students. Offered on credit/no credit basis only.

ORAL SURGERY

O S 401 Introduction to Dental Emergencies and Techniques of Local Anesthesia (2) Sp

Development of the symptomatic treatment of dental emergencies, especially those that could be considered life threatening. Portion of material presented on cardiopulmonary resuscitation by Medic II staff; includes demonstration and practice on manikins. Other material is local anesthesia techniques, including pharmacology and physiology of drugs used.

ORTHODONTICS

ORTHO 492 Clinical Adjunctive Orthodontics Seminar (1) Sp

Clinical adjunctive orthodontic diagnosis and treatment. Students will present diagnostic and treatment records to the class. Discussion of each patient will follow. Prerequisites: 490, 491, DENT 460, 461, and permission of instructor.

RESTORATIVE DENTISTRY

RES D 409 Dental Materials for Dental Hygiene (2)

Lecture-laboratory course in dental materials science stressing biological impact, correct usage, and manipulation principles. The dental hygiene student learns the basic properties of dental materials and applies these in the laboratory. The laboratory exercises provide for student self-evaluation.

COLLEGE OF EDUCATION

EDUCATIONAL CURRICULUM & INSTRUCTION

EDC&I 361 Basic Skills in Reading (3)

Covers the following: developmental readiness for reading; diagnostic teaching of reading in the classroom; reading instruction for bilingual learners; reading for special learners; developing the least restrictive environment; teaching functional reading and study skills; and materials and approaches for teaching reading. Prerequisites: 360 and EDPSY 304.

HIGHER EDUCATION

EDHE 508 Academic Governance and Collective Bargaining in Higher Education (3)

Explores the concept and operation of collective bargaining in higher education: its origin; the reasons for its growing popularity as a governance mechanism; the legal framework within which it operates; the rights, powers, and duties subsumed under its operation; and its relationship to the traditional form of faculty governance mechanisms.

COLLEGE OF ENGINEERING

CIVIL ENGINEERING

Structural Engineering and Engineering Mechanics CESM 466 Foundation Design (3)

Design considerations for foundations and retaining structures. Subsurface investigations and determination of soil properties for design. Design of shallow and deep foundations and retaining structures. Foundations and soil considerations for waterfront structures. Prerequisite: CIVE 366.

Transportation, Construction and Geometrics Engineering

CETC 564 Soil and Site Improvement (3)

Development, improvement, and utilization of marginal natural earth materials through compaction and stabilization using chemicals, portland cement, lime, asphalt, salt, and others. Includes discussion, design, and evaluation of foundation soil treatment as well as surface materials for pavement subgrades, slope protection, dust palliation, and general site improvement. Prerequisites: 424, 464.

ELECTRICAL ENGINEERING

E E 372 Computer Engineering Laboratory I (2)

Digital computer laboratory exploring the computer at the assembly language level and illustrating concepts of central processor architecture, memory organization, input/output and interrupts. Assembly language programming concepts will be applied to the solution of various laboratory problems. Hands-on microprocessor stations are used. Prerequisite or corequisite: 371.

ENGINEERING (COLLEGE COURSES)

ENGR 401, 403 Analytical Methods in Engineering I, III (3,3)

Emphasis on the acquisition of technique and experience in the application of those areas of mathematics commonly encountered in science and engineering. Techniques illustrated by case studies drawn from a number of fields. Includes application using advanced calculus, complex numbers, ordinary and partial differential equations, Laplace transforms, vectors and matrices, Fourier series, and probability and statistics. Appropriate for seniors and graduate students in engineering and science who require a survey of applied techniques but who are not prepared for, or do not seek, advanced material at the 500-level. Offered jointly with AMATH 401, 402, 403. Prerequisites: MATH 238 or equivalent for 401; 401 for 402; 402 for 403. Knowledge of FORTRAN desirable. (Last quarter offered: Spring, 1981)

HUMANISTIC SOCIAL STUDIES

Scientific Technical Communication

STC 401 Scientific and Technical Writing (4)

Formerly HSS 401. See General Catalog for course description and prerequisite.

STC 403 Managing Technical Publication (4)

Formerly HSS 403. See General Catalog for course description and prerequisite.

STC 415 Production Editing (4)

The editorial role in the preparation of scientific and technical materials for production (typesetting, layout, printing, binding, distribution). The editor's responsibilities and prerogatives as they relate to those of other professionals in the production end of the publications field. Offered jointly with CMU 415. Prerequisite: 402 or permission of the instructor.

STC 499 Professional Practice (3-5, max. 10)

Supervised internship in a working publications organization approved by the faculty adviser. A minimum of one internship is required of students taking an interdisciplinary degree in scientific and technical communication. Offered on a CR/NC basis only. Prerequisites: 401 and 402 or permission and faculty sponsor's approval.

MINING ENGINEERING

MIN E 330 Mine Surveying (3)

Practice in underground methods, use of special instruments, stope measurements, shaft surveying, solar observations, and carrying of meridian underground; production of working and geologic maps and sections

NUCLEAR ENGINEERING

NUC E 566 Fusion Reactor Engineering (3)

Emphasis is on the technological and physical aspects of large fusion experiments and reactors based on mainline concepts (Tokamak, Magnetic Mirror, etc.). Topics include superconducting magnets, neutral-beam injection, tritium systems, power handling, and fusion-fission hybrid applications. Prerequisites: 556, 565 or permission of instructor.

OCEAN ENGINEERING

O ENG 504 Marine Technology Affairs II (3) Wenk

Class-generated group research on a contemporary marine issue in Washington State leading to specific policy proposals. Offered jointly with CIVE 544. Prerequisite: 503.

O ENG 590 Wind, Wave and Earthquake Response of Structures (3) A Hartz

Fundamental principles governing the static or dynamic response of suspended structures, transmission lines, tall stacks, and other flexible structures subject to deflection, overturning, or oscillation as a result of wind, wave, and earthquake action. Offered jointly with CISM 590. Prerequisite: graduate standing in Engineering.

COLLEGE OF FISHERIES

FISH 461 Culture and Reproduction of Temperate and Warm Water Fishes (3)

History of pond fishes, reproduction, and culture of carp, catfish, bass, perch, and tilapia species; pond construction and pond management; polyculture. Prerequisite: 459 or permission.

COLLEGE OF FOREST RESOURCES

BIOLOGICAL SCIENCES

FOR B 327 Field Studies in Range and Wildlife Habitats (2)

Four week-end field trips related to range and wildlife habitats of Washington with application of materials presented in 326. For majors in wildlife science and forest management only. Prerequisite: permission.

FOR B 414 Forest Soil Fertility and Chemistry (3)

Tree growth depends in part on the interaction between chemical and biological activities within a given soil: the biological and chemical parameters which influence tree growth; soil solution chemistry and surface reactions; reactions and processes which control essential plant nutrient levels and forms in soil solutions. Prerequisite: 310.

FOR B 431 Ecological Aspects of Forest Fires (3)

Description of natural role of fire and ecosystem impacts from various fire frequencies and intensi-

ties. Examples from other regions are included but emphasis is on Pacific Northwest forests. Ecological perspectives on fire behavior and fuel dynamics. Techniques and effects of fire used for hazard reduction, site preparation, wildlife production, stand structure control, and wilderness fire management. Field trips required. Prerequisite: FOR M 430 or permission.

FOR B 519 Forest Soils Seminar (1)

Discussion, by invited speakers, on current research related to forest soils, plant nutrition, and mineral cycling. Offered on credit/no credit basis only.

FOR B 523 Graduate Studies in Range and Wildlife Habitats (1-5)

Prerequisite: 326 or permission.

MANAGEMENT AND SOCIAL SCIENCES

FOR M 250 Computer Programming (3)

Introduction to computer programming using BASIC and FORTRAN languages. Applications to forestry problems.

Tutorial Study

FOR M 533 Graduate Studies in Applied Forest Protection (1-5)

PHYSICAL SCIENCES

FOR P 410 Energy from Wood (3)

Explores principle characteristics of wood fuels and focuses upon major systems for recovering energy from them. Considers wood fuels from resource, technical, and economic points of view. Prerequisites: CHEM 101, 102.

INTERDISCIPLINARY GRADUATE PROGRAMS

APPLIED MATHEMATICS

AMATH 401 Analytical Methods in Engineering I (3)

Offered jointly with ENGR 401. See ENGR 401 (above) for course description and prerequisites.

AMATH 403 Analytical Methods in Engineering III (3)

Offered jointly with ENGR 403. See ENGR 403 (above) for course description and prerequisites.

AMATH 501 Seminar in Applied Mathematics (1, max. 6)

Special topics and selected problems of current interest in applied mathematics. Offered on credit/no credit basis only.

AMATH 564 Methods of Partial Differential Equations III (3)

Offered jointly with A A 564. See A A 564 in General Catalog for course description and prerequisite.

AMATH 569 Partial Differential Equations (3)

Properties of diffusion, wave, and Laplace-type equations; initial and boundary value problems; series expansions; transform methods; singularities, Green's functions; classification of second-order equations; theory and applications of method of characteristics; numerical techniques. Offered jointly with A A 569 and MATH 569. Prerequisite: 568 or MATH 428.

AMATH 586 Approximate and Numerical Analysis III
(3)

Offered jointly with A A 586. See A A 586 in General Catalog for course description and prerequisite.

INTERSCHOOL OR INTERCOLLEGE PROGRAMS

BIOENGINEERING

BIOEN 510 Bioengineering Seminar (1)

Topics of current bioengineering interests presented by faculty, visitors, and students. Graduate students actively involved in bioengineering research must attend regularly, participate in discussions, and make presentations. Offered on credit/no credit basis only.

BIOEN 533 Electron Microscopy (1-5)

Offered jointly with B STR 533. See B STR 533 in General Catalog for course description and prerequisite.

INSTITUTE FOR MARINE STUDIES

IMS 511 Coastal Environment Management (3)

Coastal planners and managers evaluate proposed and ongoing use activities that affect wetland, estuarine, and nearshore environments. Concepts and techniques for retrieving, analyzing, and using technical environmental information in planning and decision-making. Washington state case examples and practical exercises. Prerequisites: 503 and OCEAN 580, or permission.

IMS 512 Ocean Environment & Living Resources (3)

Analysis of characteristics and processes in the ocean environment affecting abundance of marine organisms; implications for management of oceanic fisheries. Prerequisite: 503 or permission of instructor. Course normally offered for graduate students in IMS and Fisheries.

IMS 538 Economic Aspects of Marine Policy II (3)

Development of pertinent economic concepts and their application to selected topics in marine policy. Offered jointly with ECON 538. Prerequisite: 508 or permission of instructor.

SOCIAL MANAGEMENT OF TECHNOLOGY

SMT 582 Energy Conservation (3)

Examination of past, present, and projected patterns of energy use in this country; opportunities for reducing wasteful practices and for developing more efficient techniques of energy utilization; use of price and other forms of regulation to induce energy conservation; case studies from the residential, commercial, industrial, and transportation sectors; energy conservation legislation and the public issues at federal and local levels. Emphasis on the technological, political, social, and environmental aspects. Prerequisite: 461. (Last time offered: Spring quarter, 1981.)

UNIVERSITY CONJOINT

UCONJ 442 Social and Cultural Aspects of Aging (3)

Involves faculty from the various social science fields examining the range and variation of relationships among age-linked attitudes and cultural values related to aging; the social and economic factors which influence the elderly in contemporary society;

the effects of ethnic and sex differences in socio-cultural aging. Open to upper division undergraduates and beginning graduate students interested in gerontology.

UCONJ 585 Seminar in Molecular and Cellular Biology
(1, max. 15)

For students enrolled in the Molecular and Cellular Biology Training Program. Participants present their background and current progress in their thesis research. Offered on credit/no credit basis only. Prerequisites: enrollment in doctoral degree program in biological science and in graduate research.

SCHOOL OF LIBRARIANSHIP

LIBR 512 Community Analysis and Library Change (3)

Review of the concepts, strategies, and tools for study of the community, response to community change, and promotion of desired library change. Includes experiential exercises, analysis of case studies, and investigation of the literature of relevant fields. Prerequisites: 500, 501, or permission of instructor.

LIBR 522 Descriptive Cataloging (3)

Formerly LIBR 536. See LIBR 536 in General Catalog for course description and prerequisites.

LIBR 523 Subject Analysis of Library Materials (3)

Includes work with Library of Congress and Dewey Decimal Classifications, Sears and Library of Congress Subject Headings, and other systems used in libraries today. Prerequisites: 500, 501, and 520, or permission of instructor.

LIBR 528 Literature Searching (3)

Survey of concepts and techniques of professional literature searching. Organization of computerized bibliographic files. Analysis and evaluation of data bases. Management planning of library searching services. Specialized procedures in user interviewing and request analysis. Experience in design and online execution of literature searches, using a variety of standard searching languages, including the Dialog and Orbis systems. Prerequisites: 500, 501, or permission of instructor.

LIBR 551 Literature for Young Adults (3)

Reading evaluation and sharing of literature currently appropriate to the needs, interests, and abilities of young adults, ages twelve through twenty. The application of criteria to the assessment of young adult reading materials and consideration of the uses of these materials with young people. Prerequisites: 500, 501, or permission of instructor.

LIBR 561 Serving Individual Information Needs (3)

Training in awareness and skills for perceiving and responding to the information requests of users. Effective strategies for meeting information needs are learned through use of simulations, role playing, experiential exercises, discussion, and practice. Offered on credit/no credit basis only. Prerequisites: 500, 501, or permission of instructor.

LIBR 569 Supervision of Public School Library Media Systems (3)

Develops competency in administration and supervision of school library media programs in school districts, regional educational service agencies, and state departments of public instruction. Emphasis on planning, organizing, developing, and

communicating programs and the relationship of the supervisory function to building level school library media programs. Prerequisites: 500, 501, and 568, or permission of instructor.

LIBR 571 Storytelling: Art and Techniques (3)

Study of storytelling, past and present, noting its development as an art form. Reading and analyzing storytelling materials (folk literature and literary forms) used by storytellers throughout historical periods. Learning essential techniques necessary to maintain this artistic skill in a professional field. Planning storytelling programs for various age and interest groups and situations, utilizing folk, classic, and contemporary literature.

LIBR 583 Cooperative Information Systems (3)

Analysis of cooperative information systems found among all types of libraries and information centers. Emphasis on developments in the United States and also treatment of foreign and multinational systems, with assessment of their contributions. Prerequisites: 500, 501, or permission of instructor.

SCHOOL OF MEDICINE

BIOCHEMISTRY

BIOC 570 Current Topics in RNA Tumor Virology (2)

Weekly lecture-discussion dealing with current research on the biology and biochemistry of RNA tumor viruses, with concentration on a critical evaluation of the literature. Offered on credit/no credit basis only. Prerequisites: 530 and 531, or equivalent, or permission. (Offered even-numbered years.)

HUMAN BIOLOGY

HUBIO 564 P-Principles of Pharmacology II (3.5)

Lectures and conferences on drugs acting on the central nervous system. Emphasis on physiological and biochemical mechanisms with consideration of their therapeutic and adverse effects. (For medical students only.) Prerequisite: Permission of instructor.

LABORATORY MEDICINE

LAB M 499 Undergraduate Research (*)

Specific project in clinical laboratory investigation. Offered on credit/no credit basis only. Prerequisite: permission.

LAB M 502 Laboratory Medicine Seminar (1, max. 6)

Current topics in the field of laboratory medicine. Offered on credit/no credit basis only. Open to graduate students in laboratory medicine and other medical sciences. Prerequisite: permission.

LAB M 510 Clinical Chemistry Research Conference (1, max. 6)

Current projects under research and development in clinical chemistry and immunology. Offered on credit/no credit basis only. Open to graduate students in laboratory medicine and other medical sciences. Prerequisite: permission.

LAB M 521 Advanced Laboratory Hematology (1, max. 2)

Lecture demonstrations of laboratory diagnosis in clinical hematology. Detailed description of laboratory instrumentation, special cytochemical and

immunologic analyses for analysis or complex diagnostic problems in leukemia, lymphoma, gammopathies and red cell disorders. Emphasis on clinicopathological correlation. Intended for physicians and laboratory medicine graduate students with special interest in diagnostic clinical hematology. Students will be required to read literature in preparation for the lectures. Prerequisite: graduate and post-graduate students.

LAB M 522 Hematopathology Seminar (1, max. 3)

Monthly seminar on current topics in hematopathology featuring local and guest speakers with expertise in diagnostic hematopathology. Discussion following. Emphasis on critical analysis of special laboratory tests and histopathologic disorders. Recent literature and case material will be used to discuss controversial topics in hematopathology. Intended for physicians and laboratory medicine graduate students with special interest in hematopathology. Offered jointly with PATH 522. Students will be required to read extensively in preparation for the seminar. Offered on credit/no credit basis only. Prerequisite: graduate and post-graduate students.

LAB M 600 Independent Study or Research (*)

Offered on credit/no credit basis only. Prerequisite: permission.

LAB M 680P Clinical Laboratory Testing: Methods and Interpretation (*)

Methods, tools, and principles used in the modern clinical laboratory. Choice of one to three specialty areas including chemistry, coagulation, computers, hematology, immunology, microbiology, and virology. Course investigates the methodologies in the specialty areas, identifies their limitations, and explores their usefulness in clinical medicine. Prerequisite: permission.

LAB M 700 Master's Thesis (*)

Offered on credit/no credit basis only. Prerequisite: permission.

MEDICINE

MED 645P Clinical Dermatology, Spokane (8)

Participation in clinical dermatology in private offices of four Spokane dermatologists who are on the University of Washington clinical faculty. Supervised patient care and observation for one week in each office for a total of approximately twenty-eight hours; two hours of inpatient ward rounds. Selected reading assignments in original literature and didactic sessions in dermatology for one hour each week with staff. Attendance at conjoint noon teaching conferences, Sacred Heart and Deaconess Hospitals. Prerequisite: 665P. (Limit: two students, four weeks.)

MICROBIOLOGY AND IMMUNOLOGY

MICRO 432 Mechanisms of DNA Exchange in Prokaryotes (2)

Emphasizes mechanisms of DNA exchange in prokaryotic organisms, particularly those functioning in bacteria. Prerequisite: BIOL 210 or MICRO 400, or equivalent.

MICRO 576 Basic Tumor Immunology (1, max. 15)

Weekly one-hour seminar. Current research findings. Offered on a credit/no credit basis only. Prerequisite: permission.

MICRO 577 Cellular Immunity (1, max. 10)

Weekly one-hour seminar in which cellular aspects of B and T cell differentiation and their role in disease processes are discussed and current research findings presented. Offered on credit/no credit basis only. Prerequisite: permission.

OBSTETRICS AND GYNECOLOGY

OB GY 668P Introduction to Obstetrics and Gynecology, Spokane (12)

Clerkship, equivalent to 665P, offered at Spokane, Washington (WAMI). Includes experience in several private physicians' offices. Prerequisite: HUBIO 552P. (Six weeks; limit: three students.)

OB GY 669P Introduction to Obstetrics and Gynecology, Swedish (12)

Clerkship, equivalent to 665P, offered at Swedish Hospital, Seattle, Washington. Prerequisite: HUBIO 552P. (Six weeks; limit: three students.)

OB GY 670P Introduction to Obstetrics and Gynecology, Group Health (12)

Clerkship, equivalent to 665P, offered at Group Health Cooperative of Puget Sound, which is a prepaid medical plan facility in Seattle, Washington. Prerequisite: HUBIO 552P. (Six weeks; limit: three students.)

OB GY 671P Introduction to Obstetrics and Gynecology, Anchorage (12)

Clerkship equivalent to 665P but offered at Anchorage, Alaska (WAMI). Includes experience in several private physicians' offices as well as Providence Hospital and Elmendorf Air Force Base. Prerequisite: HUBIO 552P. (Six weeks; limit: three students.)

OPHTHALMOLOGY

OPHTH 524 Modern Views of the Visual System (3)

Seminar covering modern developments in the anatomy, physiology, biochemistry, and pharmacology of the visual system. (Last time offered: Spring Quarter, 1981.)

OPHTH 686P Ophthalmology Externship (4)

Student works with a clinical faculty member in the diagnosis and treatment of ocular diseases in outpatients. Each week the student is assigned to the Group Health Cooperative Ophthalmologist responsible for the care of walk-in and urgent patients (most likely to demonstrate findings pertinent to the future practice of primary care physicians). Opportunity to learn examination techniques including tonometry, ophthalmoscopy, and biomicroscopy. Prerequisite: HUBIO 563P.

OTOLARYNGOLOGY

OTOL 490 Neural Mechanisms of Hearing (3)

Major areas within auditory neurophysiology, including peripheral mechanisms of analysis and encoding, central aspects of the development of auditory structures, binaural hearing, representations of complex sounds, other topics of current interest. Introductory-level knowledge of neurophysiology and sensory physiology assumed. Lectures, discussions, assigned readings. Prerequisite: permission.

PATHOLOGY

PATH 514 Comparative Pathology Conference (1, max. 6)

Focus on the histopathology of naturally-occurring

and experimentally induced lesions of primates, laboratory and domestic animals, fish, wildlife, and birds. Participants discuss the lesions and the basic pathogenetic mechanisms which underlie them. Prerequisites: 500 or equivalent, and permission.

PATH 522 Hematopathology Seminar (1, max. 3)

Offered jointly with LAB M 522. See LAB M 522 for course description and prerequisite.

PEDIATRICS

PEDS 553 Nutrition for Physicians and Allied Health Professionals (2)

Nutrition for health professionals presented in a series of lecture discussions and patient presentation seminars. Nutrition principles as related to health maintenance and fitness emphasized, with little emphasis given to complex disease states. Prerequisites: zoology and organic chemistry.

PHARMACOLOGY

PHCOL 529 Membrane Pharmacology (2) Sp

Advanced consideration of the fundamental properties of biological membranes and of the mechanisms of drug and hormone action on enzymes, drug and hormone receptors, and ion transport systems in the plasma membrane of cells. Discussion of current research is emphasized. Open to medical and graduate students. Offered in even numbered years. Prerequisite: 511, BIOC 440, 441, or BIOC 531 or permission of instructor.

PSYCHIATRY AND BEHAVIORAL SCIENCES

PBSCI 497 Seminar on Recent Advances in Medical and Psychiatric Anthropology (3)

Offered jointly with ANTH 498. See ANTH 498 for course description and prerequisites.

PBSCI 579 Depression: Diagnosis and Psychological Treatment (2)

Differential diagnosis of depression and depressive subtypes; emphasis on psychodynamic, cognitive behavioral and combined forms of psychological treatment of less severely incapacitated patients. Some discussion of biological approaches (e.g. anti-depressant drugs, electroconvulsive therapy, etc.) as alternative or adjunctive treatments in severe, psychotic and endogenous-like depressions. Offered jointly with PSYCH 579. Offered on credit/no credit basis only. Prerequisites: 578; graduate or professional student standing or permission; graduate course in psychopathology and personality desirable.

REHABILITATION MEDICINE

REHAB 404 Physical Therapy Management of Patients with Common Musculoskeletal Disorders (4)

Discussion of functional anatomy, biomechanics, clinical assessment and management as they relate to patients, with common musculoskeletal disorders, who have been referred to physical therapy services. Emphasis on development of appropriate therapeutic strategies. Prerequisite: majors only.

SCHOOL OF NURSING

NURS 504 Theories of Intervention Process in Family and Child Treatment (3)

Critical review of the family assessment and intervention process. Analysis of existing treatment methods regarding adaptation to psychosocial nursing practice. Prerequisite: 503.

NURS 505 Selected Topics in Psychosocial Nursing
(2-10, max. 10)

In-depth exploration of the major theoretical issues in psychosocial nursing. Seminar with analysis and discus-

NURS 534 Cultural Influences Upon Parenting (3)

Data from several cultures to compare cross-cultural similarities and differences in: definitions of ideal parenting; socializations into a parent role; social support for and controls upon parenting. Analysis of additional effects of changes in ideology, technology, and demography upon cultural parenting roles. Prerequisite: permission.

NURS 548 Management of Adults with Respiratory Dysfunction (3)

In-depth examination of problems, such as abnormal secretions and shortness of breath associated with respiratory dysfunction due to pulmonary diseases and other pathophysiological states. Lectures and laboratory sessions develop knowledge and skill necessary to problem solving and management techniques expected of the expert practitioner. Prerequisite: 540 or comparable preparation, or permission.

SCHOOL OF PHARMACY

PHARM 506 Clinical Pharmacokinetics (3)

Continuation of PHARM 505. Discussion sessions regarding the pharmacokinetics of a drug or class of drugs will be required. An original research proposal will be developed by each student and will be presented in class. Prerequisites: 484, 530, 505, PHSCI 405, and permission.

SCHOOL OF PUBLIC HEALTH AND COMMUNITY MEDICINE

ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH

ENVEH 448 Environmental Health in the Third World
(3)

Course considers the appropriate technology for water supply, excreta disposal, and pollution control for urban and rural communities. Program implementation, economic and institutional requirements, and the health issues related to development are discussed. Prerequisite: graduate standing or permission.

HEALTH SERVICES

HSERV 546 Problems in Contemporary Public Health Practice (2)

History and development of local public health departments. Traditional versus new roles and critical interactions with public and private agencies will be explored. Examples drawn from areas of current concern, e.g., prostitution and venereal disease; health promotion and disease prevention; dental health; environmental programs; alcoholism; emergency medical services; mental health

HSERV 560 Advanced Seminar in Health Economics (3)

Selected topics in health economics, including risk and insurance, medical malpractice, the market for physician services, and industry regulation. Offered jointly with ECON 547. Prerequisites: 550 or

ECON 546 and advanced-level microeconomic theory, or permission.

HSERV 563 Advanced Health Services Financial Management (3)

Develops financial management skills through case studies in budgeting, pricing, and monitoring the total financial requirements for health care institutions. Topics include budgeting principles, cost analysis, rate setting, reimbursement, profit planning, short and long term capital financing, and financial feasibility analysis. Prerequisites: 553 and/or permission.

PATHOBIOLOGY

PABIO 526 Protein Antigens (3)

Lecture and laboratory covering purification, characterization and quantitation of protein antigens from pathogenic microorganisms. Emphasis on principles of the techniques and laboratory skills. Prerequisite: entry cards.

SCHOOL OF SOCIAL WORK

SOC.W 200 Introduction to Social Work Practice (5)

Introduction to the practice of social work, the theoretical concepts and institutional framework that guides practice, and the conceptual organization of the discipline of social work. Three weekly lectures and two hours per week in field observation sessions. Lectures supplemented by audiovisual aids and by special guest practitioners.

INDEPENDENT STUDY THROUGH CORRESPONDENCE

The Office of Independent Study provides University courses for extension credit primarily by correspondence instruction to persons who wish individual instruction. Fees for Independent Study courses are separate from residence tuition and are \$20 per credit. Enrollment is not based on the quarter system but is continuous throughout the year, with one calendar year allowed to complete a course.

A regularly enrolled student who wishes to register for additional

courses for Independent Study credit should consult his or her departmental adviser prior to enrolling in an Independent Study course. Applications and additional information on enrollment procedures may be obtained from the Independent Study office, 222 Lewis Hall, or by telephoning 543-2350.
