GENERAL INFORMATION

It is the University's expectation that a student will follow University rules and regulations as they are stated in the *General Catalog*. In instances where no appeal procedure is spelled out and the student is persuaded that a special set of circumstances makes appeal reasonable, he or she may appeal the application of specific rules or regulations to the office of the dean of the school or college in which he or she is enrolled in the case of an academic matter, or to the Office of Student Affairs in the case of a nonacademic matter. These offices will either render a decision on the appeal or refer the student to the proper office for a decision.

GUARANTEED REGISTRATION ELIGIBILITY

University of Washington students who remain in good scholastic standing are guaranteed the opportunity to register each quarter as long as they maintain continuous enrollment (Summer Quarter excepted). Continuation must be in the same classification, e.g., undergraduate, postbaccalaureate (fifth-year), graduate, etc. Once a student earns a baccalaureate degree, he or she must apply for readmission as a postbaccalaureate (fifth-year), nonmatriculated, or graduate student. Exceptions to the guarantee are: (1) students under disciplinary action, (2) students with a financial hold, or (3) students not meeting their departmental continuation policies.

If an undergraduate does not enroll for one or more quarters, he or she must file an application for readmission, including payment of \$25 application fee, with the Registrar's Office. Graduate students on-leave are required to file a returning student application but not required to pay an application fee. Information on admission closing dates is available at Window 3, second floor, Schmitz Hall, or by calling 543-5920.

FULL-TIME STUDENT REQUIREMENT

To be considered a full-time student, an undergraduate must register for 12 credits and a graduate student must register for 9 credits. The full-time registration requirement varies for different agencies. Information on full-time requirements of the Veterans Administration and the Immigration and Naturalization Service may be obtained at 460 Schmitz. Consult the Financial Aid Office for its requirement on satisfactory student progress.

NONMATRICULATED STUDENTS

Nonmatriculated students register March 23 and enroll only on a space-available basis. Because nonmatriculated students register after all other students, enrollment may be closed in the following areas: mathematics, English composition, beginning foreign languages (particularly French and Spanish), business, and art. Nonmatriculated students may participate in preregistration for the Summer Quarter.

TUITION-EXEMPT FACULTY/STAFF

With the approval of their department heads, regularly admitted full-time UW faculty and staff members who have been employed six months or more may take up to 6 credits per quarter under the tuition exemption program. According to legislative action, all registrations must be on a space-available basis after other students have registered. Members of the faculty and staff who wish to utilize the exemption may not preregister; registration may occur no earlier than the last day of the registration period. Faculty/staff who register before the last day will not be eligible to use a tuition exemption that quarter. Registration appointments are not required. New faculty/staff members who enroll must be officially admitted by the Office of Admissions by the regular admission closing date; February 1 is the closing date for Spring Quarter. Faculty/staff members who are former students returning either in the same classification or as nonmatriculated students should apply at the Registration Office, Window 8, second floor, Schmitz Hall.

Employees should present their approved tuition exemption cards at Sections, Hutchinson Hall, according to the schedule listed below. A \$5 registration fee will be collected at the time of registration. The alphabetical priority will change each quarter. Regularly admitted faculty and staff members who are unable to meet this schedule may register late by paying \$25 if registering by the tenth day of the quarter; \$75 if registering after the tenth day of the quarter.

Tuition-exempt faculty/staff are not entitled to other student services such as those available at the Hall Health Center and the Intramural Activities Building. Therefore, UW student cards will not be issued to faculty and staff. Faculty/staff identification cards may be used for library services.

"ACCESS" PROGRAM FOR OLDER ADULTS

The University of Washington waives tuition for Washington residents sixty years or older who wish to attend classes as auditing students, on a space-available basis. The fee is \$5, whether one or two courses are attended. As auditors, they do not receive credit and are not expected to do laboratory work or to take examinations. Students who attend the University under the Access program are limited to two courses per quarter. Registration may be made in person on March 23, between 8 a.m. and 2 p.m. at the Sections branch office, Hutchinson Hall. Interested students should proceed to the area marked *Access*. For additional information on mail-in registration or about the program in general, telephone Conference Management, 543-2300, between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m.

AUDITORS

Auditors, except Access program students, pay standard tuition and fees and must be regularly admitted and registered in the course. Although credits for audited courses will not be listed on the schedule of classes, they will be included in the billing on the fee statement. Such credits count in the calculation of fees.

Attendance in courses as an auditor is by consent of the instructor involved and is conditioned by the extent to which space is available. Permission to audit is ordinarily granted for lecture classes only. An auditor may not participate in class discussion or laboratory work, and his or her registration may be canceled at the discretion of the instructor.

No entry is made on the permanent record for courses audited. To receive credit for an audited course, the student must register for the class for credit in a subsequent quarter.

Auditors follow registration instructions below.

DISABLED STUDENTS

Various support services, including priority registration, are available to students with disabilities. Contact the Coordinator for Disabled Student Services, 482 Schmitz, 543-8924, for information on equipment, technical aids, and accommodations to meet individual needs. *Access: University of Washington*, a guidebook to buildings on the campus, and an accompanying map may be obtained from the office.

Hutchinson Hall registration or add/drop area is reached by a full flight of stairs, so wheelchair users and other students with mobility limitations should go to the Sections Office at 264 Schmitz. Students using this location need no Change of Registration Appointment Card (although those registering for the first time do need a registration appointment).

Students with disabilities who register for a science laboratory class should telephone the Coordinator, 543-8924, and the academic adviser of that department immediately to evaluate whether some accommodation of the facilities will be necessary.

ATHLETIC EVENTS

Students may purchase a Husky Football Season Pass at the Husky Ticket Office, 101 Graves, or at the HUB Ticket Office, for admission to the following athletic events: men's and women's basketball, baseball, track and field, and swimming. For additional information, telephone 543-2200.

REGISTRATION INSTRUCTIONS

ACADEMIC ADVISER

See an academic adviser to discuss your educational objectives and to learn the procedures involved in registering at the University. Have an idea of the courses you would like to take before seeing an adviser by reviewing the *General Catalog* and the quarterly *Time Schedule*.

UNDERGRADUATE SATISFACTORY PROGRESS

Students admitted to the University to pursue baccalaureate degrees are expected to make satisfactory progress toward the attainment of that degree, and are expected to enter a major and graduate after completion of a reasonable number of credits.

By the time undergraduate students have completed 105 credits, they either must be accepted in their major or have their premajor status extended temporarily by an adviser.

Students who do not declare a major by the time they have earned 105 credits, or who have exceeded the graduation credit limits, or who have not been accepted in a major as fifth-year or postbaccalaureate students, will have a "hold" placed against registration beginning the following quarter.

Students must graduate with their first baccalaureate by the time they have completed 30 credits beyond the credits required for the first degree or concurrent degrees. Departmental advisers may grant extensions beyond the 30 credit limit.

Postbaccalaureate students are expected to be either preparing for admission into a degree program, seeking an additional bachelor's degree, or working toward a certificate. Students admitted as "postbaccalaureate undeclared" must declare a major by the time they have earned 30 credits beyond their last degree, and once a degree objective has been declared, must make progress toward that degree as evidenced by the courses they have completed satisfactorily. College advisers may grant extensions beyond the 30 credit limit.

The Committee on Admissions and Academic Standards may terminate a student's enrollment if the student demonstrates lack of academic progress as evidenced by excessive course repeats, course drops, or University withdrawals and cancellations. The student may be reinstated with the approval of the student's college and the Committee. EOP students will be allowed to be reinstated in consultation with the Office of Minority Affairs.

PREREGISTRATION (Continuing Students Only)

1. Eligibility

Preregistration is reserved for all continuing students *except* tuition-exempt faculty/staff, older adults auditing under the Access program, and nonmatriculated students. These last three groups may register only during the last day of in-person registration (see Spring Quarter calendar).

Continuing students who withdraw during the first week of two consecutive quarters (Summer Quarter excepted) will not be eligible to register as continuing students for the third quarter. Such students must reapply as former students returning to the University.

2. Submitting the Preregistration Form

Mark-sense registration forms are available at advisory offices and at Registration Office, Window 3, second floor, Schmitz Hall. Please note that some courses listed in the *Time Schedule* have restricted enrollment and will require entry cards. Also, undergraduates will not be scheduled for more than 19 credits until the first day of the quarter. This is done to allow all students a chance to develop a basic program.

Students preregistering may turn in forms at:

3. If You Miss Preregistration

Obtain an in-person registration appointment and register by March 22 at Window 7, Schmitz Hall. After March 23 you will be required to register late and to pay a \$25 late registration fee at the Registration Office, 225 Schmitz, if registering by the tenth day of the quarter; \$75 after the tenth day of the quarter.

4. Schedule of Classes

All students who preregister will be scheduled by computer at one time. The scheduling priority is: freshmen, seniors, graduate students, postbaccalaureate (fifth-year), juniors, and sophomores.

5. Registered Students

Students who preregister but are not scheduled into any courses are not considered registered students, and are not eligible for

preregistration the following quarter. Students in this category must submit a Former Student Application for the next quarter they wish to attend the University.

IN-PERSON REGISTRATION (New and Returning Students)

1. Eligibility

In-person registration is primarily for newly admitted and returning former students. Continuing matriculated students who miss preregistration, tuition-exempt faculty/staff, older students in the Access program, and nonmatriculated students also register during in-person registration. All students, except Access students, must be admitted to the University and issued a registration appointment before attempting to register.

2. How to Register

On or before your registration appointment, obtain a *Time Schedule* and a Registration Instructions worksheet from your advisory office or from the Registration Office, second floor, Schmitz Hall. (These may also be obtained in the Hutchinson Hall registration area *while registration is in progress*.) Obtain permission and/or course entry cards (if required) as indicated in the *Time Schedule* before attempting to register. Once your registration is completed by the Sections staff, you are obligated for tuition and fee payment unless you officially withdraw by the fifth day of the term. Undergraduates will not be scheduled for more than 19 credits until the first day of the quarter to allow all students a chance to develop a basic program.

3. Submitting the Registration Form

- New and returning former students register by appointment only on March 17, 18, 21, 22.
- If you are a continuing matriculated student who did not preregister, you must obtain an in-person registration appointment and register by March 22. Continuing students who request in-person registration appointments and register after March 22 will be required to register late during the first ten days of school and pay a \$25 late registration fee; after the first ten days of the quarter, a \$75 late registration fee is assessed.
- If you are registering March 17–22 go to the Sections branch office, Hutchinson Hall, on the date and time indicated on your registration appointment. Students with a mobility disability must register in 264 Schmitz because there are stairs leading to the Hutchinson gymnasium. Engineering students will register in Hutchinson Hall.
- Nonmatriculated students, tuition-exempt faculty/staff members, and students in the Access program register only on March 23.

4. Schedule of Classes

- If you register February 4–19, your schedule of classes will be mailed to the address you indicate on the registration form. All students registering during this period are scheduled by computer at one time. The scheduling priority is: freshmen, seniors, graduate students, postbaccalaureate (fifth-year) students, juniors, and sophomores. Schedules will be mailed March 8.
- If you register March 17–23 your courses will be scheduled while you wait and you will be given a copy of your completed program when you have finished registering.

ENTRY CARDS

Certain courses and sections require entry cards for registration. Students who request these courses (and/or sections) on their registration request forms will not be registered in the courses unless the requests are accompanied by entry cards. An entry card alone is not sufficient. The course and schedule line number (SLN on entry card) must also be requested on the mark-sense registration form. Obtain course entry cards for courses designated with the symbol >>> in the margin of the *Time Schedule*. Information on where to obtain entry cards is found in the body of the *Time Schedule*, either as a comment before the course listing or just after the title of the course.

SATISFACTORY/NOT SATISFACTORY

Students may elect to take certain courses on a Satisfactory/Not Satisfactory basis. Advisers should be consulted, and in no case are students allowed to register for more than one course or 6 credits on a Satisfactory/Not Satisfactory basis in a given quarter. A course in which an "S" is earned may not be used to satisfy any department, college, or University requirement, except that the credits may be applied to the minimum of 180 credits required for graduation. Each instructor will report conventional grades to the Registrar, who will convert satisfactory grades (2.0 or greater) to "S," and unsatisfactory grades (less than 2.0) to "NS" for the student's transcript. No

more than 25 S/NS credits will apply to an undergraduate degree. S/NS must be elected during initial registration or added or dropped during the official change of program period. Undergraduate students earning grades of 2.0 or above receive a grade of S (Satisfactory) while grades below 2.0 are recorded as NS (Not Satisfactory).

Graduate students earning grades of 2.7 or above receive a grade of S (Satisfactory), while 2.6 or below are recorded as NS (Not Satisfactory). With the approval of his or her graduate program adviser or Supervisory Committee Chairperson, a graduate student may elect to take any course for which he or she is eligible outside of his or her major academic unit on an S/NS basis.

In cases of withdrawal, the W is recorded. Neither S nor NS are included in the grade-point average. N, I, and X are recorded until the instructor reports the final grade, or in cases of incompletes received by undergraduates, until the I is converted by the Registrar.

CREDIT/NO CREDIT-ONLY COURSES

Some courses are offered on a CR/NC-only basis. It is not necessary to register S/NS to take these courses, because the only grades assigned by the instructor are CR (Credit) or NC (No Credit). Neither CR nor NC is included in the grade-point average. In cases of withdrawal a W is recorded. N, I, and X are recorded until the instructor reports the final grade, or in cases of Incompletes received by undergraduates, until the I is converted by the Registrar.

LATE REGISTRATION

Students who register after the official registration period will be charged a \$25 late registration fee if registering by the tenth day of the quarter; \$75 after the tenth day of the quarter.

REGISTRATION CHANGES

1. Change Appointments and Late Fee

a) Changes to a student's program should be completed during the following change periods: March 17, 18, 21-23, March 28-April 1.

Appointments are not required to (1) drop a course, (2) change to or from S/NS, (3) change variable credits, (4) add an Entry Card course. Evening-only students do not need appointments for the 4:30-6:00 p.m. change period during the first week of the quarter. Graduate students do not need appointments during the first week at 264 Schmitz. A student who arrives more than a half-hour late will be required to make a new appointment. Wheelchair users and other students with mobility limitations should use the sections office at 264 Schmitz; no Change of Registration Appointment card is required.

Students will be expected to present Spring Quarter 1988 UW student identification cards when requesting appointments. No more than one change appointment will be issued to a student at a time. Additional change appointments will be issued only after the initially assigned appointment has been used or the date has expired.

Students in the schools/colleges of Medicine, Dentistry, Nursing, Pharmacy, Public Health and Community Medicine, Ocean and Fishery Sciences, and Forest Resources, and the Department of Biology may make changes during the first week of the quarter, without an appointment, in the fourth floor lobby of the T-wing, Health Sciences Building.

Engineering students may make changes without an appointment or register late with an appointment, in 209 A-B HUB, during the first week of the quarter.

Changes made after the official change period are restricted and, if permitted, cost \$20 and may result in fee forfeiture (see item 3 of this section).

b) Undergraduates in the College of Arts and Sciences must have their adviser's signature to carry more than 22 credits; 30 credits is the limit per quarter.

2. Grades in Dropped Courses and Drop Restrictions

a) *Undergraduates.* Undergraduate students who drop courses after the change periods receive no entry on their academic record if the drop is made during the first two weeks of the quarter, except if all courses are dropped then a university withdrawal date is entered. Drops made during the third and fourth weeks of the quarter will be recorded with a "W." No drops are permitted after the fourth week except a limited number may be dropped as determined by the number of credits earned at the University. While completing the first 44 credits at the University, a student has three drops permitted after the fourth week. Any of these three drops not used at the time 45 credits are earned are forfeited. After 45 credits have been

completed at the University, the student earns one late drop for each 45 credits earned. These may be accumulated and used as necessary. No drops, other than hardship withdrawals may be made after the last day of instruction.

b) *Graduate Students.* Graduate students who drop courses after the first two weeks of the quarter receive a grade of "W." No drops are permitted after the seventh week of instruction.

c) Students may petition the Registrar for a hardship withdrawal after the regular drop deadline if: (1) the student is unable to complete the course in question because of a severe mental or physical disability, or (2) unusual or extenuating circumstances beyond the student's control prevented the student from dropping the course by the regular drop deadline. Petitions must be filed promptly after the occurrence of the event that gave rise to the need for dropping the course. Hardship withdrawals are for dropping individual courses only. See section on Withdrawal from the University for the procedure to follow for dropping all courses for the quarter; no petition is required.

3. Fee Forfeitures or Refunds

a) Students will be billed for the number of credits, including audit hours, on their programs at the end of the first week of the quarter. Only partial fee reductions will result for courses dropped after the first week of the quarter.

b) Students dropping courses after the first seven calendar days of the quarter and through the thirtieth calendar day of the quarter will be expected to pay one-half of the tuition and fees associated with that course.

c) Courses dropped after the thirtieth calendar day receive no refund.

d) The effect of fee forfeitures on the over-18-credit surcharge is as follows: forfeitures for courses dropped that exceeded 18 credits are charged the same as in (b) and (c) above. Also, if a student drops a course after the thirtieth calendar day and adds another, total credit charges will include credits that are added with no reduction for credits dropped.

e) Drops become effective the date received in Sections.

4. Courses Added After the Official Change Period

a) As a general rule, no courses may be added after the official change period. Exceptional cases may be approved if both the instructor of the course and the dean of the student's college consent.

b) Courses audited may not be changed to a credit registration after the first two weeks of the quarter.

FEE PAYMENT

1. You should indicate selection of your permanent or local address on your mark-sense registration form for fee statement mailing. If you have not received a fee statement by the end of the second week of the quarter, contact the Student Accounts and Scholarships Office for the amount of tuition due.

2. You may pay your fees in person in the Student Accounts and Scholarships Office or mail them to UW, Student Accounts and Scholarships Office, 129 Schmitz, PE-10, Seattle, WA 98195, before the tuition due date. Fees must be paid by Friday of the third week of the quarter whether or not you have received a statement. Payments postmarked on or before the due date are accepted without a late fee. Metered mail received after the due date is subject to penalties as described in # 3 below.

3. If you fail to pay by the deadline you may continue to pay your tuition in the week following the due date, plus a late fee as follows:

If fees have not been received in the Student Accounts and Scholarships Office by this time, your registration will be cancelled. Students permitted to reregister after cancellation for nonpayment will be charged a \$75 fee, in addition to their tuition.

4. If you reregister, you must reregister for all classes on your schedule at the time of registration cancellation. (Fees will include appropriate charges for classes dropped during the forfeiture period.) Reregistration will not be possible after the last day of instruction, June 3. Please note: Even if your registration is canceled you will continue to owe one-half of your tuition.

5. Credit card checks are not accepted.

6. Tuition and fees not paid by the end of the academic quarter will be subject to an interest charge of 1% per month, or fraction of a month, (12% A.P.R.), beginning with the month following the end of the quarter.

Special Course and Laboratory Fees

The amounts charged for tuition and fees normally cover University charges for course registration. Some courses, however, have extraordinary expenses associated with them and in such cases the University may charge additional fees in amounts approximating the added instructional or laboratory costs.

CHANGE OF ADDRESS

If you change your address after you have turned in your mark-sense registration form, be sure to complete a change of address form at the Registration Office. Forms are available at Window 3, second floor, Schmitz Hall. *You are responsible for notifying the Registrar's Office of any address change.*

STUDENT INSURANCE

UW students who remain registered through at least the first six days of instruction in the quarter are eligible to enroll in the student health insurance plan. The following students are not eligible:

1. Those enrolled only in programs administered by Continuing Education or Conferences and Institutes, including but not limited to extension, correspondence, independent study, continuing studies, noncredit courses, or the Access program.

2. UW employees attending classes under the employee tuition exemption program.

Students who do not specifically request a particular student insurance plan or who do not specifically state they do not wish student insurance automatically will be enrolled and billed for stu-

dent only quarterly health insurance premium.

If you are billed for student insurance and wish to add, cancel, or change your coverage, complete the appropriate section on the remittance copy of the billing statement and pay the revised amount or you may do so in person in the Student Accounts and Scholarships Office by the date tuition is due. Tuition/fees and the student health insurance premium must be paid in full by the due date to be eligible for health insurance.

International Students

International students must subscribe to the student insurance plan. Penalties for not paying insurance fees by the tuition due date are the same as tuition penalties under #3 of Fee Payment section. Exceptions may be granted by the International Services Office if the student presents proof of other medical insurance coverage. Students are responsible for obtaining a waiver each Autumn Quarter (or upon initial admission if other than Autumn Quarter), because waivers are valid only through Summer Quarter each year. Students holding insurance policies that expire during the academic year are responsible for obtaining new waiver cards, as necessary. To be eligible for the student health insurance plan, the student must pay, in full, tuition, fees, and the student health insurance premium by the due date. International students who want coverage during the Summer Quarter and are not enrolled Summer Quarter must prepay the Summer Quarter premium during one of the preceding quarters.

WASHPIRG

An optional \$2 fee is indicated on the fee statement for the Washington Public Interest Research Group, a student research organization. If you do not desire to support this activity, simply pay the regular tuition and fees. If you want to support WASHPIRG, pay the regular tuition and fees plus \$2.

WASHINGTON STUDENT LOBBY (WSL)

An optional \$1 fee is indicated on the fee statement for the Washington Student Lobby (WSL), a voluntary, independent organization of university students whose purpose is to influence the state legislative process on matters of special interest to students. Students not wishing to support this activity simply pay the regular tuition and fees. Students supporting WSL pay the regular tuition and fees plus \$1.

**WITHDRAWAL FROM THE UNIVERSITY
(DROPPING ALL COURSES FOR THE QUARTER)**

1. Obtain an approved withdrawal form from your adviser or from the Withdrawal Office.

2. Present the withdrawal form to the Withdrawal Office, Sections, 264 Schmitz. *Withdrawals are effective the date they are received in the Registrar's Office.* Fees owed will be based upon the date the withdrawal is received in the Registrar's Office. No withdrawals accepted after the last day of instruction, June 3.

Continuing students who withdraw during the first week of two consecutive quarters (Summer Quarter excepted) will not be eligible to register as continuing students for the third quarter. Such students must reapply as former students returning to the University. For example, a student who withdraws during the first week of Spring Quarter and Autumn Quarter must reapply as a returning former student for Winter Quarter.

3. Students are required to turn in their student I.D. cards when they withdraw and are not eligible to continue using University services or facilities after their withdrawal.

The forfeiture schedule for withdrawing from the University is as follows:

(a) Students withdrawing before the sixth day of the quarter do not pay tuition or fees. New and returning students forfeit their \$50 enrollment service fee.

(b) Students withdrawing on the sixth day or through the thirtieth calendar day continue to owe one-half of their tuition and fees.

(c) Students withdrawing after the thirtieth calendar day continue to owe full tuition and fees.

Students who were unable to turn in their withdrawal in time may petition the Comptroller's Office. Petition forms are available at the Student Accounts and Scholarships Office, 129 Schmitz.

Courses dropped as part of a University withdrawal completed during the first two weeks of a quarter receive no grade and no entry except date of withdrawal is made on the student's permanent academic record. Withdrawals completed after the first two weeks result in the courses being assigned a grade of "W."

GRADE APPEAL PROCEDURE

A student who believes that he or she has been improperly graded should first discuss the matter with the instructor. This should be done before the end of the following academic quarter (not including Summer Quarter). If the student is not satisfied with the instructor's explanation, a written appeal to the chairperson of the department (or the dean in a nondepartmental school or college) may be submitted no later than ten class days after his or her discussion with the instructor. A copy of this appeal should be sent to the instructor.

The chairperson, or dean, shall consult with the instructor, within ten calendar days of receipt of the appeal, to ensure that the evaluation of the student's performance has not been arbitrary or capricious. Should the chairperson believe the instructor's conduct to be arbitrary or capricious and the instructor declines to revise the grade, the chairperson (or the dean in a nondepartmental school or college), with the approval of the voting members of his or her faculty, shall appoint an appropriate member, or members, of the faculty of that department to evaluate the student's performance and

assign a grade. The dean and provost shall be informed of this action.

Once a student submits a written appeal, this document and all subsequent actions on this appeal are recorded in written form for deposit in a department or college file.

Final examinations should be administered in accordance with the above examination schedule.

The dean may permit an instructor to change the time of a final examination upon prior application demonstrating good cause for such change. In such cases, the following guidelines shall be observed:

1. With the dean's permission, the final examination may be postponed or moved to an earlier time within the examination period if agreed to by all students and the instructor. Before approving the rescheduling of a final examination, the dean shall obtain assurances that the change will not have an undue adverse impact on the students. The dean shall notify the Registrar of the approval granted for changing the date of a final examination.
2. An instructor shall not, except in very unusual circumstances, grant permission to individual students for an early examination. If the student is unable to take an examination on the scheduled date, the procedure outlined in the following paragraph should be followed.
3. A student absent from any examination through sickness or other cause, judged by the instructor to be unavoidable, shall be given an opportunity to take a rescheduled examination or perform work judged by the instructor to be the equivalent. If the instructor determines that

neither alternative is feasible during the current quarter, the instructor may exempt the student from the requirement. Examples of unavoidable cause include death or serious illness in the immediate family, illness of the student, and, provided previous notification is given, observance of regularly scheduled religious obligations.

4. Classes that meet on the hour use the first full hour of instruction to determine the time of examination. For example, a class that meets at 10 a.m. uses the 10:30 a.m. examination time.
5. Classes that begin on the half hour and last longer than one hour use the actual starting time to determine the examination time. For example, a class that meets at 7:30 a.m. and continues until 9:00 a.m. would use the 7:30 a.m. time.
6. Classes in which the entire class meets at the same hour every day, in the same room, may use that room at 8:30 a.m. or 2:30 p.m. for a three-hour examination. All other examinations are limited to one hour and fifty minutes unless other arrangements are made with Room Assignments.
7. If an examination is held at a time other than the above schedule indicates, instructors must check with Room Assignments to make sure that the room is going to be available.

ARCHITECTURE

ARCH 493 ROME PREPARATION SEMINAR (2)
Seminar dealing with history, culture, topography, and customs of Rome, Italy. Required for students enrolling in 495, 496, or 497.

LANDSCAPE ARCHITECTURE

L ARC 200 LANDSCAPE ARCHITECTURE FIELD TRIPS (2)
Five field trips introduce typical landscape architecture projects and demonstrate scope of the landscape architecture field. Visits to major projects in the Puget Sound Region include city and county parks, river parks, harbors, downtown redevelopments, streetscapes, campus headquarters, and others. Class room sessions include discussion, lecture, and slides.

COLLEGE OF ARTS AND SCIENCES

AMERICAN INDIAN STUDIES

AIS 330 AMERICAN INDIAN HISTORICAL EXPERIENCE AND CONTEMPORARY ISSUES (5)
Trends in interrelations of native Americans and European immigrants since 1500. Current problems in Indian-white relationships examined in historical context. Development of Indian Policy and consequences of major legislative acts including the Allotment Act, Indian Reorganization Act, Termination and Relocation. Implications for contemporary Indian education, religion, and health. Recommended: 102.

ANTHROPOLOGY

ANTH 314 SOCIETIES AND CULTURES OF INSULAR SOUTHEAST ASIA (5)
Joint with SISEA 314. See International Studies for description.

ANTH 415 APPLIED ETHNOGRAPHY (3)
Examines the social context of applied cultural anthropology and prepares students for nontraditional uses of anthropological theory, knowledge, and training. Topics include the rationale for applied ethnographic research, professional training, the research proposal/contract, social change, applied anthropology, and the research product.

ANTH 430 THE ANTHROPOLOGY OF MUSIC (3)
Joint with MUSIC 480. See Music for description.

ANTH 432 SOCIOLINGUISTICS (3)
Joint with LING 432. See Linguistics for description.

APPLIED MATHEMATICS

AMATH 509 THEORY OF OPTIMAL CONTROL (3)
Joint with MATH 509. See Mathematics for description.

AMATH 516 NUMERICAL OPTIMIZATION (3)
Joint with MATH 516. See Mathematics for description.

ART

ART HISTORY

ART H 503 METHODOLOGY SEMINAR: NONWESTERN ART HISTORY (5)
Introduction to the professional study of nonwestern art history, including Asian, African, Native American, and Oceanic; each quarter focuses on one aspect of study, such as traditionalism in art, problem of field research, or issues in the cross-cultural study of art.

ASIAN LANGUAGES AND LITERATURE

Hindi

HINDI 431 ADVANCED CONVERSATIONAL HINDI (2, MAX. 8)
Advanced Hindi conversation, based on selected reading passages. Prerequisite: 323 or equivalent or permission of instructor.

Indian

INDN 404 READINGS IN URDU LITERATURE (3, MAX. 18)
Readings in Urdu prose and poetry. Urdu prose composition. Prerequisite: 403 or equivalent.

CHEMISTRY

CHEM 417 ORGANOMETALLIC CHEMISTRY (3)
The chemistry of the metal-carbon bond for both main group and transition metals. Emphasis on structure and reactivity, with applications to organic synthesis and catalysis. prerequisites: 160 or 164 and 236 or 337; recommended: 416.

CLASSICS

CLASS 324 GREEK AND ROMAN ATHLETICS (3)
Examination of Greek and Roman athletic festivals and events, and the place of athletes and sport in ancient society.

Latin

LAT 402 MEDIEVAL LATIN POETRY (3)
Readings and discussion of medieval Latin poetry. Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

COMMUNICATIONS

CMU 425 ADVANCED JOURNALISM METHODS (5, MAX. 10)
Reporting regional trends; analyzing and using aggregate data; news planning. Prerequisites: 322 and 328, or permission of instructor.

CMU 503 RESEARCH METHODS (5)
Introduces and compares basic methods of research in communications.

COMPUTER SCIENCE

C SCI 415 (STUDIES IN THE MIDDLE AGES)(5)

Principles and programming techniques of artificial intelligence: LISP, symbol manipulation, knowledge representation, logical and probabilistic reasoning, learning, language understanding, vision, expert systems, and social issues. No credit if 473 has been taken. Prerequisites: 373, or 211 and permission of instructor.

C SCI 576 IMAGE UNDERSTANDING (3)

Overview of computer vision, emphasizing the middle ground between image processing and artificial intelligence. Topics include image formation, preattentive image processing, boundary and region representations, and case studies of vision architectures. Prerequisites: 573, or 557 and E E 562, or equivalent; or permission of instructor.

DRAMA

DRAMA 201 DRAMATIC ACTION (5)

Examination of play structure through analysis of one-act plays in all genres, with special attention to plotting and the various means used to achieve a unity of action as the basis of all drama.

DRAMA 313 SCENERY CONSTRUCTION (3)

DRAMA 391 BEGINNING TECHNICAL PRACTICES (1-3, MAX. 9)

Laboratory course involving specific production assignments, either in-shop or in-theatre, or both. Prerequisites: 290, 291, 292 or receiving a production assignment.

DRAMA 401 DRAMA COLLOQUIUM (1-0-0, MAX. 3)

Weekly lectures by guest artists, presentations by faculty or students of works in progress. Required of all undergraduate and graduate drama majors.

DRAMA 441 BEGINNING PLAYWRITING (5, MAX. 10)

Writing exercises and drafts of a one-act play provide students with first experience in writing for performance. Readings of representative one-act plays introduce genres and writing styles. Prerequisites: 253 or 353; and 210, 211, 212; or practical theatre experience.

DRAMA 454 PROJECTS IN ACTING (3, MAX. 9)

Rehearsal and classroom performance of dramatic literature of various periods and styles. Prerequisite: audition.

DRAMA 516 STAGE RIGGING (3)

Theory and practice of hemp, counterweight, and motorized rigging systems for the stage.

DRAMA 541 GRADUATE PLAYWRITING SEMINAR I (3-6, MAX. 18)

Workshop for development of new plays. Graduate playwriting students develop one-act and full-length plays, which continue through rewriting until ready for public reading. Readings of representative contemporary full-length plays address specific problems of playwright's crafting.

DRAMA 542 GRADUATE PLAYWRITING SEMINAR II (3-6, MAX. 18)

Continuation of play development through classroom critique, rehearsed readings, and twenty-hour rehearsal workshop productions. Readings address more complex craft problems. Regular rewriting of each student's work.

GENETICS

GENET 365 GENERAL GENETICS (4)

Advanced course in general genetics for students who have been introduced to basic genetic concepts. Cytogenetics, microbial genetics, intragenic recombination, mutation and DNA repair, gene regulation in development, molecular basis of gene regulation. Prerequisite: BIOL 210. (Not open for credit to students who have completed 360.)

GEOGRAPHY

GEOG 230 URBANIZATION IN DEVELOPING NATIONS (5)

Urbanization in developing countries. Analyzes cities in their cultural and economic contexts, geographical patterns of cities, and internal city structure. Evaluates problems facing these rapidly growing cities, and considers selected policy solutions.

GERMANICS

GERM 205 LITERATURE AND CONVERSATION (5)

Introduction to classics of German literature and discussion of literary and general topics in order to develop or fluency. Prerequisite: 202 or equivalent. (Last quarter offered A 89.)

GERM 312 MAJOR FIGURES OF GERMAN LITERATURE (3)

Focus on major figure such as Goethe, Schiller, Kleist, Fontane, Thomas Mann, Kafka. Emphasis on his/her cultural and sociopolitical contexts. Reading of literary and nonliterary texts, including film, art, political, historical, and philosophical texts. Prerequisite: second-year German or equivalent or permission of instructor.

HISTORY

History of the Americas

HSTAA 365 THE HISTORY OF AMERICAN FILM (5)

American films and film-making technology; the film industry and its financing and marketing strategies. Cultural, social, political, and economic impact of films upon American society. (Last quarter offered Sp 88.)

INTERNATIONAL STUDIES

East Asian Studies

SISEA 314 SOCIETIES AND CULTURES OF INSULAR SOUTHEAST ASIA (5)

Cultural, political, economic traditions of insular Southeast Asia, Indonesia, Malaysia, the Philippines. Early Indianized states; growing influence of Islam; Western European conquests; developed colonial societies, their legacies; modern nationalism, problems faced by newly independent states; important cultural continuities. Joint with ANTH 314. Prerequisite: one 200-level International Studies or Anthropology course.

LINGUISTICS

LING 432 SOCIOLINGUISTICS (3)

Social variation in the phonology, morphology, syntax, lexicon of languages and dialects. Nonstandard language, diglossia, pidgins and creoles, gender differences, bi- and multilingualism, the ethnography of speaking, pragmatics, and language attitudes. Joint with ANTH 432. Prerequisite: 400; recommended: concurrent registration in 451 or permission of instructor.

LING 525 SEMINAR IN THEORETICAL PHONOLOGY (4, MAX. 12)

Individual and joint research on selected topics in theoretical phonology. Topics vary. Typical offerings include phonology and the lexicon, syntax and phonology, phonological representations. Prerequisite: 453.

MATHEMATICS

MATH 509 THEORY OF OPTIMAL CONTROL (3)

Trajectories obtained from ordinary differential equations with control variables. Controllability, optimality, the maximum principle. Relaxation and the existence of solutions. Techniques of nonsmooth analysis. Joint with AMATH 509. Prerequisite: real analysis on the level of MATH 426; background in optimization corresponding to AMATH/MATH 515. (Offered even numbered years.)

MATH 516 NUMERICAL OPTIMIZATION (3)

Methods of solving optimization problems in finitely many variables, with or without constraints. Steepest descent, quasi-Newton methods. Quadratic programming and complementarity. Exact penalty methods, multiplier methods. Sequential quadratic programming. Cutting planes and nonsmooth optimization. Joint with AMATH 516. Prerequisite: 515.

MUSIC

Music

MUSIC 369 BEGINNING JAZZ IMPROVISATION III (1)

Beginning jazz improvisation techniques used in the performance of intermediate level jazz standard compositions. Prerequisite: 368 or permission of instructor.

MUSIC 480 THE ANTHROPOLOGY OF MUSIC (3)

Analysis of aspects of anthropological thought influential in ethnomusicology. Critical evaluation of dominant theoretical schools and modes of explanation (e.g., evolutionist, diffusionist, historical particularist, structuralist, functionalist, symbolist, semiotic) through detailed examination of seminal texts. Joint with ANTH 430. Prerequisite: 430.

MUSIC 545 PRECEPTORIAL READINGS IN SYSTEMATIC MUSICOLOGY III (3)

Examines the significant research literature on acoustical, psychological, and social systems operating in music.

Music Applied

MUSAP 318,368,418,468 PRIVATE INSTRUCTION: GUITAR (2-3, MAX. 9; 2-3, MAX. 9; 2-3, MAX. 9; 2-3, MAX. 18)

MUSAP 338,388,438,488 PRIVATE INSTRUCTION: GUITAR (3-4, MAX. 12; 3-4, MAX. 12; 3-4, MAX. 12; 3-4, MAX. 18)

NEAR EASTERN LANGUAGES AND CIVILIZATION

NE 260 THE MIDDLE EAST IN FILM (3)

Surveys the cinema of Egypt, Iran, Israel, Turkey, and other Middle Eastern nations; compares and contrasts the films with Middle Eastern literature from the twentieth century. Both films and literature illustrate how Middle Easterners view the world: their concepts of self versus society, religion, art, and politics.

PHYSICS

PHYS 228 ELEMENTARY MATHEMATICAL PHYSICS (3)

Applications of mathematics in physics with emphasis on the mechanics of particles and of continuous systems. Prerequisites: 123 and MATH 238.

POLITICAL SCIENCE

POL S 455 ANALYTICAL MODELS OF AMERICAN POLITICS (5)

Presents several analytic models of American politics and uses computer simulations to demonstrate their differences. Topics include resolution of conflict, leadership, legislative processes, mass politics. Prerequisites: introductory courses in American government; 202 and at least two 300/400-level courses in the area of American government.

POL S 576 POLITICAL CULTURE (5)

Values, beliefs, and rituals that guide political action in society. Some approaches emphasize symbolic sphere of value and belief over material conditions of power and economic production. Other approaches emphasize material relations. Focus on reconciliation of symbolic and materialist approaches which explain intervention of the modern state in cultural processes.

POL S 598 INDEPENDENT WRITING I (3-5)

Supervised research and writing for graduate students completing the M.A. essay of distinction.

POL S 599 INDEPENDENT WRITING II (3-5)

Supervised research and writing for graduate students completing the Ph.C. essay of distinction.

PSYCHOLOGY

PSYCH 402 INFANT BEHAVIOR AND DEVELOPMENT (3/5)

Intensive examination of psychological development in the first two years of life. Discusses basic and advanced techniques for assessing psychological development in infancy. Critically examines classic theories of human infancy and a wide range of new experiments about infant behavior and development. Prerequisite: upper-division standing.

PSYCH 464 METACOGNITION (3)

Self-monitoring and self-control of an individual's own cognitive processes. Emphasis on metacognitive aspects of memory and judgment under uncertainty. Methodology and findings of empirical research on metacognition. Prerequisites: 355 or equivalent; recommended: 462.

PSYCH 545 SEMINAR IN MOTOR CONTROL (2)

Variable topic seminar addressing neural, developmental, and behavioral processes underlying motor behavior. Prerequisites: permission of instructor.

PSYCH 586 CLINICAL PERSONALITY ASSESSMENT (3)

Use of objective personality inventories in the description of normal and abnormal personality and use of such information in case conceptualization and treatment planning. Among the measures considered are the Minnesota Multiphasic Personality Inventory and the Millon Clinical Multiaxial Inventory. Prerequisite: clinical psychology graduate standing.

ROMANCE LANGUAGES AND LITERATURE

French

FREN 406 ADVANCED FRENCH GRAMMAR (5)

Reviews problems of French grammar. Considers differences between forms and structures of French and English. Addresses problems of effective teaching of French. For students with at least three years of college French and for beginning teaching assistants. Prerequisites: 301,302,303; and permission of instructor.

SOCIOLOGY

soc 447 SOCIAL MOVEMENTS (5)

Social movements as collective attempts to change society: why people join; characteristics of successful and unsuccessful movements; consequences of social movement activities. Prerequisite: previous course in political sociology or political science.

SCHOOL AND GRADUATE SCHOOL OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION

MANAGEMENT AND ORGANIZATION

Human Resources Management - Organizational Behavior

HRMOB 470 MOTIVATION AND PERFORMANCE (4)

Different strategies for influencing employee motivation and performance are reviewed. Included are reward systems, goal setting procedures, and various techniques to enlarge and enrich one's job. Effects of these formal and informal strategies on job attitudes are examined. Prerequisite: junior standing or above.

HRMOB 555 EMPLOYEE ATTACHMENT TO THE ORGANIZATION (3)

Theory, research, and practice on selected topics such as employee turnover, absenteeism, organizational commitment, job involvement, socialization, career management, and organizational climate examined. These concepts discussed from the standpoint of prediction, understanding, and control. Prerequisite: permission of the graduate office.

HRMOB 560 NEGOTIATIONS (3)

Analyzes the strategy used in negotiations other than labor/management bargaining for the purpose of developing skills necessary to devise a negotiating strategy appropriate to the situation. Learning methods include negotiation of contracts in simulated business settings, case studies, and readings. Prerequisite: permission of the graduate office.

SCHOOL OF DENTISTRY

DENTISTRY

DENT 541P ETHICS IN DENTISTRY (1)

Designed to improve ethical reasoning, sensitivity skills, convey ethical standards and values of the profession through small group discussions. Standardized tests of moral reasoning and ethical sensitivity given at beginning and end of course.

ORAL MEDICINE

ORALM 460 CLINICAL MANAGEMENT OF PATIENTS WITH DISABILITIES (*, MAX. 10)

Participation in chair/bedside dental treatment of a broad range of disabled populations, including homebound and institutionalized patients. Prerequisites: 404 and permission of instructor.

COLLEGE OF EDUCATION

EDUCATIONAL CURRICULUM AND INSTRUCTION

EDC&I 550 EDUCATIONAL TECHNOLOGY RESEARCH (3)

Analysis, critique, and practical experience with research studies of all types (experimental, ethnographic, evaluation) concerning questions of interest to educational technologists. Prerequisite: 480 or permission of instructor.

EDC&I 582 SEMINAR ON INSTRUCTIONAL SYSTEMS DEVELOPMENT (3)

Critical analysis of processes involved in the development of instructional systems. To be taken concurrently with an internship in instructional development (601, to be arranged separately). Prerequisite: 481 or permission of instructor.

EDC&I 585 TECHNOLOGY AND THE CULTURE OF EDUCATION (3)

Study of the social impact of technology on education in the United States and elsewhere: social, political, and cultural factors affecting educational communication and technology; roles and relationships among instructors and learners; appropriate technology in developing countries; technology's long-term influence on thought and values. Prerequisite: 480 or permission of instructor.

INDEPENDENT STUDY, RESEARCH, AND FIELD EXPERIENCE

EDUC 423 EDUCATING DIVERSE GROUPS (3)

Provides background information on socioethnic/cultural diversity in United States; its impact on decision making in school structure, school programming, administration. Socioeconomic, ethnic minority, women, handicapped groups. Emphasizes educational implications of discrimination based on gender, race, ethnicity, social class, handicapping conditions. Prerequisite: admission to teacher education program or teaching experience.

COLLEGE OF ENGINEERING

INTERDEPARTMENTAL CURRICULAR PROGRAM

ENGR 275 FUNDAMENTALS OF COMPUTER OPERATING AND ORGANIZATION (4)

Organization and operation of digital computers. Representation of information, instruction formats, addressing, flow of control, processor and system components, and soft-ware systems. The digital computer studied at various levels (microprogramming, machine, and system). Prerequisite: 141.

ENGR 280 INTRODUCTION TO SYSTEM ENGINEERING (4)

Applied general systems theory is presented as a framework for system engineering. Concepts of system hierarchies, tradeoffs, and feedback all applied in two team oriented projects. Prerequisite: 141.

ENGR 493 SYSTEM ENGINEERING PROJECT (3)

Develops requirements and specification and management systems for system development. Integration of simulation optimization, control, and decision theory methods to the system engineering of large, complex projects. Prerequisites: senior standing and permission of instructor.

CIVIL ENGINEERING

Core Courses

CIVE 430 ETHICS IN ENGINEERING (2-3)

Professional engineering code of ethics discussed from a perspective of contemporary Western ethical theories with specific case studies. The additional credit is earned for a written and oral presentation of a specific ethical case study. Prerequisite: senior standing in engineering or permission of instructor; recommended: PHIL 240.

Environmental Engineering and Science

CEWA 471 HAZARDOUS WASTES ENGINEERING (3)

Classification of hazardous wastes; resource conservation, Recovery Act Regulations; superfund; groundwater contamination, solutions. Hazardous waste site remedial action; case histories; sampling; landfill design. Stabilization and processing technologies including incineration, carbon adsorption, emerging techniques. Risk assessment analysis, siting problems for hazardous waste facilities. Prerequisite: CIVE 351 or permission of instructor.

ELECTRICAL ENGINEERING

E E 370 INTRODUCTION TO DIGITAL SYSTEMS AND COMPUTERS (4)

Introductory course in digital logic, Boolean algebra, combinational and sequential circuits, design and operation of digital computers including ALU, memory, I/O, and control. Computer operation and organization including instruction formats, addressing, and stacks.

E E 536 VLSI LAYOUT (3)

VLSI layout methodologies are covered. All MOS design styles and software tools available for layout are taught along with students' project work in the laboratory. The students' projects fabricated and tested in subsequent classes. Minor emphasis on ECL and GaAs layout techniques. Prerequisite: 535 or equivalent.

E E 565 COMPUTER-COMMUNICATION NETWORKS I (3)

Computer-communication network concepts and principles; queuing systems and applications; network architectures and protocols; modeling, performance analysis, and design of terrestrial networks; multiaccess techniques; satellite, ground-radio, and local area networks. Prerequisite: 505 or equivalent.

E E 568 IMAGE PROCESSING COMPUTER SYSTEMS (4)

Components of digital image processing computer systems examined. Two-dimensional filtering and optimal filter design as well as basic image processing operations covered. Selected advanced image processing topics introduced. Individual student project included. Joint with BIOEN 568. Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

E E 579 ADVANCED TOPICS IN ELECTROMAGNETICS, OPTICS, AND ACOUSTICS (1-5)

Topics of current interest in electromagnetics, optics, and acoustics. Content varies from year to year, based on current professional interests of faculty member in charge. May be repeated for credit. Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

MATERIALS SCIENCE AND ENGINEERING

MSE 599 SPECIAL TOPICS IN MATERIALS SCIENCE (1-5, MAX. 5)

Studies of special advanced topics in materials science. Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

SCIENTIFIC AND TECHNICAL COMMUNICATION

STC 515 HUMAN/MACHINE COMMUNICATION (3)

Relationship between formal and natural communication systems. Impact of work in artificial intelligence, natural language processing, computer simulation of cognitive processes, and other formal studies of human communication on the field of scientific and technical communication. Prerequisites: 505, 510 or permission of instructor.

STC 520 PUBLICATION MANAGEMENT (3)

Management of technical publications and information systems: identifying roles of communication in organizational systems; defining internal, external organizational communication needs; designing a publications unit including planning, organizing, staffing, directing, controlling, evaluating (performance, product). Emphasizes industrial, governmental publishing; periodical publishing; consulting and specialized contract services. Prerequisite: 510 or permission of instructor.

STC 599 SPECIAL PROJECTS (1-4)

Written report required. Prerequisite: permission of program director.

COLLEGE OF FOREST RESOURCES

FOREST RESOURCES MANAGEMENT

FRM 323 SILVICULTURE AND PROTECTION (6)

Silviculture techniques, including nursery practices, clearcutting, seed trees, shelterwood, selection cutting, site preparation, regeneration methods, thinning, fertilization, chemicals, and regional silviculture in the Northeast, Southeast, Midwest, Rocky Mountains, California, Pacific Northwest, and Alaska. Fire, insects, disease, and wildlife aspects integrated. Taught at Pack Forest. Multiple use field trips.

FRM 411 FOREST SOIL MICROBIOLOGY (4)

Role of soil microbes in forest ecosystems; types, numbers, and ecology of microorganisms in forest soils, decomposition processes, nitrogen fixation, nitrification, denitrification; influence of forest management and disturbance on microbial processes. Quantitative methods in soil microbiology, mycorrhizae. Prerequisite: basic soils or permission of instructor.

FRM 495 SENIOR PROJECT (5)

Individual study of a forest resources management problem under the direction of a faculty member. Prerequisites: 471; approved plan of study and permission of major advisor; generally taken in last quarter of residence.

FRM 502 STRUCTURE AND FUNCTION OF FOREST ECOSYSTEMS (5)

Behavior of forest ecosystems: carbon, nutrient and hydrologic cycling; factors controlling paths and flow rates of materials; contrasts in ecosystem structure and function among forest types.

FRM 569 ECONOMICS OF FOREST PRODUCTS TRADE (3)
Structure and trends in world forest products trade, trade barriers, trade policies, and methods of modeling and forecasting international forest products markets. Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

INTERSCHOOL/INTERCOLLEGE PROGRAMS

BIOENGINEERING

BIOEN 568 IMAGE PROCESSING COMPUTER SYSTEMS (4)
Joint with E E 568. See Electrical Engineering for description.

QUANTITATIVE SCIENCE

Q SCI 597 SEMINAR IN QUANTITATIVE ECOLOGY (1, MAX. 9)
Lectures and discussions of current problems in quantitative ecology. Credit/no credit only.

UNIVERSITY CONJOINT COURSES

UCONJ 503 INTERNATIONAL HEALTH EDUCATION (1)
Weekly two-hour seminar provides in-depth and concrete preparation for international health work involving extensive use of case studies; a problem-solving format; and time for teaching practical skills and tools relevant to clinical, epidemiological, and laboratory needs. Each seminar prepared and presented by a faculty/student team.

UCONJ 524 DEVELOPMENTAL NEUROBIOLOGY (3)
Survey of issues in developmental neurobiology, neurogenesis and differentiation; electrophysiological, morphological, and neurochemical phenotype; neuronal pathways and synaptic contacts; cellular and synaptic plasticity; and their molecular biological, morphological, electrophysiological, and behavioral approaches. Prerequisites: courses and/or background in neurophysiology, neuroanatomy, molecular neurobiology.

GRADUATE SCHOOL OF LIBRARY AND INFORMATION SCIENCE

LIBR 533 DESIGN OF RELATIONAL BIBLIOGRAPHIC DATA-BASIS (3)
Declaration of tables and columns of data. Analysis of tables with the normalization process. Linking tables together to express one-to-many and many-to-many relationships. Strategies with tabular file managers. Economics of bibliographic files. Artificial intelligence and expert system applications. Survey of microcomputer relational database systems. Prerequisites: 501, 503, or permission of instructor.

LIBR 566 SPECIAL LIBRARIANSHIP (3)
Seminar in the practice of special librarianship in business and industrial firms, government agencies, and in the free-lance sector. Emphasis on use services and information resources. Prerequisite: twenty-four credits in Master Librarianship program.

LIBR 585 INFORMATION IN THE PUBLIC POLICYMAKING PROCESS (3)
Demystifying information base for policymaking in a democracy. Review of theoretical needs and opportunities for input of information associated with three branches of government and each phase of policymaking. Focus on actors who bring information to

policymakers. Federal, state, and local comparisons. Joint with PB AF 581. Prerequisite: 500 or permission of instructor.

SCHOOL OF MEDICINE

BIOLOGICAL STRUCTURE

B STR 561 NEUROANATOMICAL TECHNIQUES LABORATORIES (*, MAX. 4)
Detailed training in modern neuroanatomical techniques provided in laboratories of departmental faculty to individual students. Discussion of literature related to that method expected. Prerequisites: 560 and permission of instructor.

BIOMEDICAL HISTORY

BI HS 501 ALTERNATIVE SYSTEMS OF MEDICINE (1)
Introduction to the philosophies and practices of the major alternative systems of medicine. Historical and anthropological analysis of alternative medicine accompanied by presentations by practitioners of systems such as chiropractic, naturopathy, and traditional Chinese medicine. Prerequisite: enrollment in medical or other health professional school desirable.

CONJOINT COURSES

CONJ 516 CURRENT LITERATURE IN LABORATORY ANIMAL MEDICINE (1, MAX. 12)
Critical evaluation of recent articles on laboratory animal medicine and science. Emphasis on literature dealing with spontaneous diseases of laboratory animals, biology and husbandry, zoonotic diseases, and animal models of human disease. Discussions on experimental design, use of animals in research, and methods of reviewing manuscripts. Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

CONJ 518 CLINICAL CONFERENCE SEMINAR (1, MAX. 12)
Clinical reports of cases of spontaneous and induced diseases, animal models of human disease, and zoonotic diseases are presented and discussed. Disease prevalence is reviewed and preventive medicine measures are discussed. Diagnostic exercises assigned. Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

MICROBIOLOGY AND IMMUNOLOGY

MICRO 522 CURRENT RESEARCH IN MICROBIOLOGY (1)
Weekly student and faculty seminar presentations based on the current literature. May be repeated for credit. Credit/no credit only. Prerequisite: graduate standing in microbiology.

OPHTHALMOLOGY

OPHTH 501P OPTHALMOLOGY PRECEPTORSHIP (1)
Individualized experiences with one or more of the full-time faculty members of the department covering research, teaching, and patient care. Student observes activities in the clinic, hospital ward, operating room, and research laboratories. Prerequisites: first- or second-year medical student and permission of instructor.

PHYSIOLOGY AND BIOPHYSICS

PBIO 507 ADVANCED PHYSIOLOGY (3)
Respiration physiology: alveolar ventilation, pulmonary mechanics, and regulation of respiration. Acid-base balance. Renal physiology. Endocrinology: hormone receptors and transduction

mechanisms, reproduction, pancreatic endocrine function, adrenal, thyroid, and parathyroid function. Temperature regulation. Gastrointestinal secretion, absorption, and motility. Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

REHABILITATION MEDICINE

REHAB 518 RESEARCH SEMINAR ON HANDICAPPED INFANTS (3)

Introduces students to recent research relating to early identification and intervention of handicapped children. Emphasis placed on the critical evaluation of published articles in the areas of early identification and intervention. Prerequisite: clinical experience or coursework related to handicapped infants.

SCHOOL OF NURSING

NURSING SCIENCE

NURS 599 SELECTED READINGS IN NURSING SCIENCES (1-3, MAX. 18)

Analysis or synthesis of selected readings with faculty mentor. Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

PARENT AND CHILD NURSING

PCN 519 PEDIATRIC PULMONARY NURSING (2-5)

Applies knowledge base of pediatric anatomy and physiology with assessment and treatment of pulmonary pathophysiology in children. Includes nursing issues in caring for children and families with acute and chronic lung disease. Prerequisite: permission of instructor.

PHYSIOLOGICAL NURSING

PN 503 HUMAN RESPONSES IN HEALTH AND ILLNESS II (3)

Survey of selected human responses to environmental demands in health and illness at physiologic, pathophysiologic, experiential, and behavioral levels. Responses discussed in framework of concepts relevant to physiologic nursing. Focused on concepts such as immune response, stress response, circadian rhythms, sleep, and cognition. Prerequisite: graduate standing.

PN 504 NURSING THERAPIES IN CRITICAL/CONTINUING CARE (3)

Focuses on therapeutic modalities commonly employed by nurses to assist patients with a variety of human responses to health problems. Weekly seminars and out of class assignments to encourage students to critically analyze current therapies. Prerequisites: 502, 503, or permission of instructor.

COLLEGE OF OCEAN AND FISHERY SCIENCES

INSTITUTE FOR MARINE STUDIES

IMS 508 NATIONAL MARINE POLICY PROCESSES (3)

Fosters an appreciation for the institutional dimensions of marine policy processes. Students gain an understanding of the marine policy context at the national level and a sophisticated appreciation of the dynamics that drive policy formulation and policy implementation. Prerequisite: 507 or permission of instructor.

IMS 560 METHODS SEMINAR (2)

Prepares students for thesis work. Drawing on the philosophy of science from the natural, social, and policy sciences, examines such topics as research design, data-collection, analysis, write-up and abstract/applied research.

SCHOOL OF PHARMACY

PHARMACY PRACTICE

PHARM 415 APPLIED DRUG THERAPY IN NURSING (3)

Clinical applications of drugs in primary care and hospital settings. Selected drugs compared and contrasted as to indications; efficacy; therapeutic, adverse effects; monitoring parameters; dosing principles; dosage forms; common drug interactions. Individualization of patient drug therapy requirements emphasized. Prerequisites: 315; CONJ 340, 341, 342; PATH 444 or equivalent; PN 323, 324.

PHARM 461 PHARMACEUTICAL MARKETING (3)

Introduction to marketing concepts as applied to delivery of pharmaceutical products and services. Trends in the pharmaceutical marketplace; focus on pharmaceutical industry practices as they affect community and institutional pharmacy. Prescriber and consumer behavior relative to legend and OTC drugs. Prerequisite: pharmacy major.

PHARM 491 CANCER PHARMACOTHERAPEUTICS (2)

Provides in depth exposure to the pharmacotherapy of cancer, covering supportive care (antibiotics, antiemetics, analgesics, nutrition) to the antineoplastic agents themselves. Specialists in each area serve as guest lecturers. Geared to pharmacists. Prerequisite: third year professional standing in the School of Pharmacy.

GRADUATE SCHOOL OF PUBLIC AFFAIRS

PB AF 517 ECONOMICS OF THE PUBLIC SECTOR (3)

Methods for analyzing effects of public expenditures and taxes on individuals' and firms' behavior, on economic efficiency, and on equity and distribution of income. Theory and practice of intergovernmental fiscal relations. Application of theory to formulation of public policy stressed. Prerequisites: 516, ECON 400.

PB AF 581 INFORMATION IN THE PUBLIC POLICYMAKING PROCESS (3)

Joint with LIBR 585. See Library and Information Science for course description.

PUBLIC HEALTH AND COMMUNITY MEDICINE

ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH

ENVH 569 OCCUPATIONAL FITNESS (3)

In-depth treatment of interaction between physical requirements of occupation tasks and the individual's capacity to perform, emphases on jobs requiring manual material handling. Techniques of job analysis, validation of standards, criteria for new/redesign, and employee screening. Prerequisite: 566 or permission of instructor.

EPIDEMIOLOGY

EPI 528 EXPOSURE MEASUREMENT IN EPIDEMIOLOGY (3)
Principles and methods of measuring exposures and covariates in epidemiologic studies. Validity and reliability of measures, questionnaire design, effects of measurement error, maximizing response rates, quality control procedures, measurement of specific exposures. Prerequisite: 513.

HEALTH SERVICES

HSEV 539 TOPICS IN MATERNAL AND CHILD HEALTH III (2)
Normal and abnormal growth and development (neurological, cognitive, psychological, and social) from infancy to adulthood. Techniques for assessing growth and development evaluated; neurological, cognitive, psychological, and social development addressed. Seminar format. Prerequisite:s graduate standing; permission of instructor.

HSEV 562 HEALTH POLICY SEMINAR (3)
Provides an opportunity to gain and apply tools of policy analysis. Alternative techniques of gathering synthesizing, and analyzing available information in a timely fashion. Attention focused on written and oral presentation to a policy audience on a "real" health issue. Prerequisite: 552 or permission of instructor.

HSEV 574 COMMUNITY HEALTH AND NEEDS ASSESSMENT (3)
Approaches and tools to identify, measure health/health care problems in defined communities. Uses, limitations of available data; community surveys; public health surveillance methods; problem identification; needs assessment techniques; measurement issues; analytic methods; data presentation for program, policy planning. Prerequisite: graduate standing in public health or permission of instructor.

HSEV 576 MARKETING HEALTH SERVICES SEMINAR (3)
Application of planning, design, development, and promotional strategies for health services. Emphasis on examining relevant literature, applying appropriate marketing concepts and techniques to health services, achieving organizational goals within community opportunities and constraints. Examination of examples of successful and unsuccessful marketing programs. Prerequisites: 512, 513, or permission of instructor.

W COURSES OFFERED SPRING QUARTER 1988

Students who plan to take majors in the College of Arts and Sciences and who started college Autumn Quarter 1983 or later must complete 10 credits of courses designated "W." W courses are not English composition courses but, rather, are courses in which a substantial amount of writing is required. Almost any department can offer W courses.
